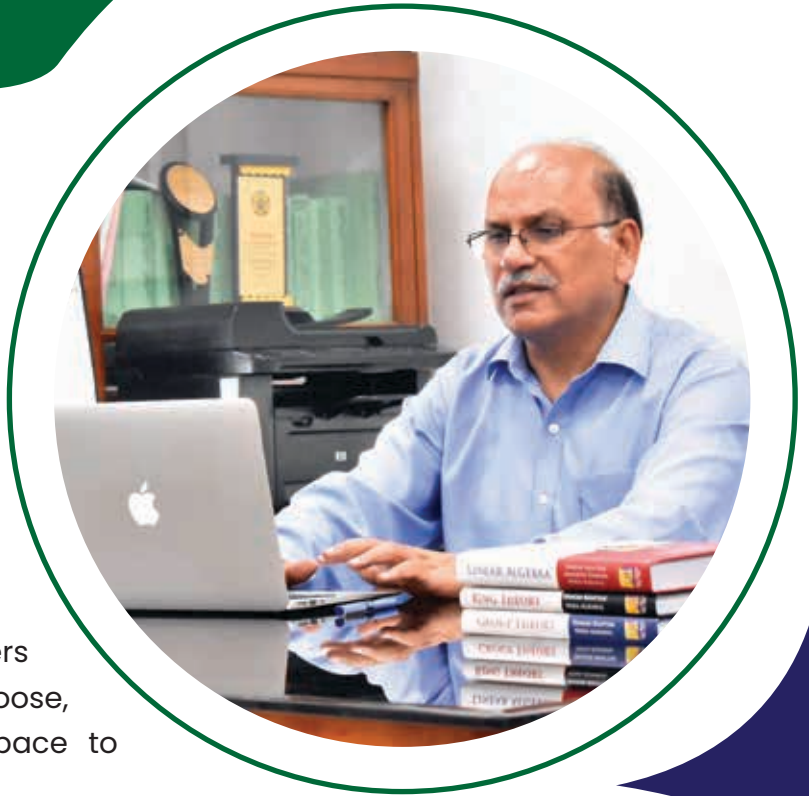

COMMON UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST (CUET)

All candidates seeking admission to UG Programs of the University of Delhi for the academic year 2025-26 must go through the information bulletin (https://www.du.ac.in/uploads/07032025_UG-BOI_compressed.pdf) and register to CUET(UG) 2024: <https://cuet.nta.nic.in/>

The National Testing Agency has been mandated by the Ministry of Education and UGC to conduct the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) for admission into Undergraduate Programmes in Central Universities under the Ministry of Education, and other participating Universities / Institutions / Organizations / Autonomous Colleges since the year 2022. The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) will provide a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the country, especially those from rural and other remote areas and help them to establish better connect with the Universities. A single examination will enable the candidates to cover a wide outreach and to be part of the admission processes to various Central Universities.

The candidate must note that the role of NTA is limited only for conducting CUET(UG)-2025, declaration of results, and handling of queries related to the entrance examination.

The University of Delhi hereby announces the eligibility requirement for admission to its Undergraduate Programs through the CUET (UG)-2025. For more detailed information the candidates can visit admission website (<https://admission.uod.ac.in/>) for academic session 2025-2026.



COMMON SEAT ALLOCATION SYSTEM (CSAS)

Under-Graduate (UG) Programs are offered by the University of Delhi through its colleges in various streams of studies under different Faculties, namely Arts, Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, Education, Interdisciplinary & Applied Sciences, Music, Commerce & Business Studies, Mathematical Sciences, Sciences and Social Sciences. For the academic year 2025-26, admission to all UG Programmes of all the colleges of UoD will be done on the basis of online Common University Entrance Test (Undergraduate)-2025 (CUET(UG)-2025) only.

Simply appearing in CUET(UG)-2025 will not be a sufficient condition to secure a seat in University of Delhi. For admission to the UoD UG Programmes, a candidate must apply in Common Seat Allocation System UG CSAS 2025

(https://admission.uod.ac.in/userfiles/downloads/18062025_CSAS-UG_compressed.pdf).

The CSAS(UG)-2025 will serve as a single window for admission to all UG programs of all Colleges of the UoD. All candidates desirous of taking admission to a College of UoD should apply only through CSAS(UG) 2025. Only the admissions taken and granted through the official online platform of the UoD (CSAS(UG) 2025) will be considered valid.

ORD. XV-B-MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS

- 1) All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
- 2) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify on this behalf.
- 3) Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a) physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/ Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
 - b) carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
 - c) any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
 - d) violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - e) any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
 - f) any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
 - g) wilful destruction of institutional property;
 - h) creating or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
 - i) causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j) ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students:
 - a) be expelled; or
 - b) be for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - e) be debarred from taking University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
 - f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.



- 5) The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education and Librarian shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments, in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
- 6) Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.
- 7) At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Rules that have been framed there under by the University.

ORD.XV-C. PROHIBITION OF AND PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

- 1) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any, way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.



- 4) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of college, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also Suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- 7) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice- Chancellor accordingly.
- 8) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- 9) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- 10) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- 11) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- 12) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

- a) Financial assistance in the form of a Fee Concession is available for deserving students. Online applications in the prescribed form should be submitted before the date notified for this purpose. No student will be considered for the grant of financial assistance unless they have submitted an application by the notified date.
- b) Some State Government Free ships are available for students belonging to special categories. Information regarding such awards will be put up on the College Notice Board. Applications for these Free ships have to be made through the College by the notified date.
- c) The 'Prime Minister's Scholarship Scheme (PMSS) is being implemented to encourage technical and post-graduate education for the widows and wards of the deceased/ex-service personnel of Armed Forces. The scheme is funded out of National Defence Fund administered by Prime Minister's Office. Scholarships are available for education at various technical institutions (medical, dental, veterinary, engineering, MBA, MCA and other equivalent technical institutions having AICTE/UGC approval).
- d) Kirori Mal College offers short-term paid internship program called **Principal KMC Internship Scheme (PKIS)**, for bonafide under-graduate students of Kirori Mal College only. This is a Part-time internship, introduced in February, 2024 for the first time. Students can apply online for the **PKIS** by filling out the registration form. The 'selected students' work closely with Kirori Mal College Administration/Departments. The internship is offered during the academic session for a duration of 3 months in a semester. Interns work for flexible 6 hours per week (24 hours per month). Stipend provided is Rs. 2,400 per month per intern on the completion of 24 hours of work. This internship scheme is on the format of 'Vice Chancellor Internship Scheme' (VCIS) of Delhi, therefore the selection process for PKIS interns is based on 70% CGPA + 30% interview/group discussion.
- e) **College Research Council** is committed to promoting research, innovation and collaborations with various industries and institutes. A college Research Council has been constituted on 13th June, 2023 to oversee the Research activities and the Research projects going in the college. These are an important part of the learning process for college students.
 - To encourage students to do Interdisciplinary projects under supervision of faculties of different departments.
 - Participation in projects broadens their classroom learning and supports the development of a range of skills.
 - These projects will provide opportunities for students to demonstrate their creativity and innovation.



CERTIFICATE COURSE IN FOREIGN LANGUAGES: FRENCH & GERMAN

Learning a foreign language proficiently opens up numerous career opportunities in various sectors for the young minds. To empower the student with multilingual skill the Kirori Mal College, announces the start of Certificate Course in Foreign Languages: French & German, from the academic session 2024-25. The certificate courses will be conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi. The College adheres to the academic calendar of the University in all academic matters. Examinations will be held according to the schedule announced by the University/Department. Upon successful completion of the course, participants will be able to receive a certificate of international standards. Each language certificate course has a capacity of 50 seats. The candidate passed in senior secondary school certificate examination (10+2) conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, or an equivalent exam, with a minimum aggregate of 45% marks are eligible for admission. LIBRARY

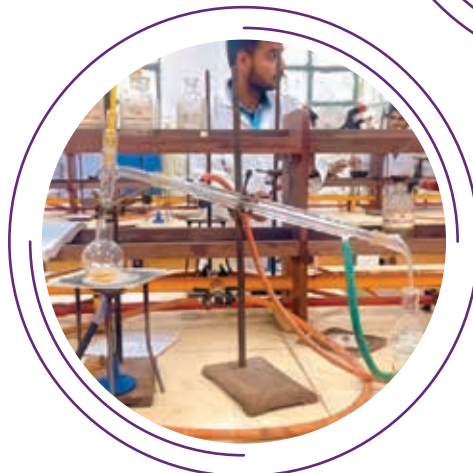


The N.S. Pradhan Memorial Library is one of the most extensive libraries in the University of Delhi. It caters to all the academic requirements of the college and also has an excellent collection of fiction and non-fiction texts, and a variety of books for general awareness. It is fully computerized, housing about 1.5 lac books and can accommodate about 350 students. The library subscribes to 52 journals in different subjects, 30 Periodicals / Magazines of general taste and 16 newspapers. Internet facility is available for students and teachers in the Portal Room. A Reference Section with a very good collection is situated on the First Floor for consultation.

A new computer room with the latest version of JAWS has been provided for visually impaired students on the ground floor. Oxford Dictionary for the VI has been purchased. There is a collection of 81 books in Braille, 22 tape recorders, 100 audiocassettes and 25 iPods for VI students. The college library also subscribes to magazines for the visually impaired.

LABORATORIES

The college has modern, well-equipped and efficiently managed laboratories for all the science courses offered – Physics, Chemistry, Zoology and Botany. Besides these, the departments of Geography, Computer Science and Statistics also have their own laboratories.





SEMINAR ROOM

The seminar room serves as a venue for interactive seminars and discussions, committee meetings and career counselling sessions. The audio-visual facilities available make it the ideal space for film screenings and workshops.

DEPARTMENT OF BENGALI

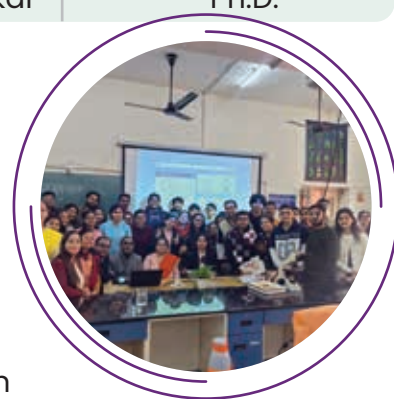

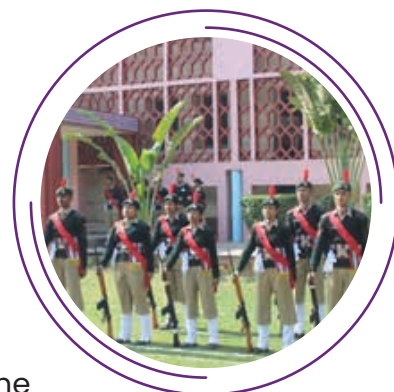


DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

Year after year, we have provided outstanding players to the University, Delhi State and junior India teams in several sports. Para-sporting events are organized each year by the College in which Prayas – the enabling unit of the college, plays an active role. Khelo Prayas – for disabled students, was organized to promote para-athletics that saw participation from over 15 colleges of the University.

They are: Graphic Awards—Leonardo da Vinci Award for the Front Cover, Vincent van Gogh Award for the Back Cover, Amrita Sher-Gil Award for the Best Contribution in Art Gallery; Academic Awards—Kalidāsa Award for Tattva-Mīmāṃsā (Sanskrit Section), Rabindranath Tagore Award for Krishti (Bangla Section), Kaifi Azmi Award for Nikahat-e-Gul (Urdu Section), Dr. Harivansh Rai Bachchan Award for Shabd-Darshan (Hindi Section), RK Narayan Award for Pensamiento (English Section), Kautilya Award for Vāṇijya Vāni (Commerce Section), Dr. BR Ambedkar Award for Mānviki Prakoshtha (Social Science Section), and Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Award for Experimental Lore (Science Section).

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement session this year witnessed an unprecedented turnout, with 155 recruiters actively engaging with our students, resulting in a record-breaking Gross CTC of INR 17.8 Crores. Reflecting the diverse spectrum of opportunities available, the session boasted an impressive Average Offered CTC of INR 7.3 LPA, with an exceptional Average Accepted CTC of INR 10.80 LPA. This year, more than 100 students successfully secured placements, with the highest CTC touching an impressive INR 24.8 LPA.



The success of our internship program is equally noteworthy, with over 380 recruiters offering around 1000 internship opportunities this year. Notably, the average aggregate stipend amounted to INR 33,750, while the highest stipend reached a remarkable INR 1,70,000.

An institution's alumni network plays a pivotal role in its success, contributing significantly to its reputation. Avenues – The Placement Cell facilitated connections with over 215 firms this session, simplifying the job search process for students. The median CTC offered this year was INR 6 LPA, with an average CTC of INR 5.87 LPA. Notably, the highest package offered was INR 21 LPA, with a Gross Total Annual Compensation reaching an impressive INR 10.19 Crores, signaling strong demand for Kirori Mal College graduates.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

Keeping in mind the need to create a more just society for India's historically marginalized sections, its religious minorities, women, persons with disabilities et al, the college has set up an Equal Opportunity Cell. The need for such a cell at this level comes from the understanding that higher education is a tool for attaining social and economic equality.
