Basic Principles of Ayurveda

- 1. Trigunas: Sattva, Rajas and Tamas.
- Pañcamahābhūtas: Ākāśa (Space), Vāyu (Air), Teja or Agni (Fire), Jala (Water) and Pṛthvī (Earth).
 Tridoṣas: Vāta, Pitta and Kapha.
- Saptadhātus: Rasa (fluid), Rakta (blood), Māmsa, Meda (fat), Asthi, Majjā and Śukra.
- Trayodasāgni: Jatharāgni (gastric fire), Saptadhātvāgni and Pācabhātāgni.
 Trimalas: Purīṣā (faeces), Mūtra (urine) and Sveda (sweat).
