National Service Scheme (2018-2019)

National Service Scheme-Kirori Mal College (NSS-KMC) Unit is working through University of Delhi under Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Govt. of India since the programme was launched by MYAS in 1969.

The volunteers of NSS- KMC unit work with the motto: 'Not Me But You'. This reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless service. All the volunteers work towards giving back to the society. The strength of **NSS-KMC** cogitates in its tag line

"Sahas Se Sahyog Karen" which means to have courage, be / make others empowered to extend helping hand. With this aim all volunteers participate in all the activities, to be more focused, accountable, develop leadership, quality contribution to the community and social work. Unit works under two broad wings: **SAHYOG**- "CHILD EMPOWERMENT WING" *"EACH ONE TEACH ONE*

PROGRAMME" and SAHAS-"WOMEN EMPOWERMENT WING".

Under **SAHYOG**, we aim at the holistic development of the children. The children are not only given academic knowledge but also the basic knowledge required for them to move forward in the society. Children are made to understand the significance of studying, why each festival is celebrated and many other things. Volunteers teach the students regularly from Monday to Saturday from 3:00 to 5:00.

YOGA DAY: (21st June):- In an interactive session with Mr. V.N. Joshi, volunteers learnt a few asanas which can be easily done in morning such as tadasana, vrikshasana etc.



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EACH ONE TEACH ONE PROGRAMME AND CULTURAL AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT:

(All round the year):-

The volunteers of NSS, KMC are strong believers of "Educations for All". For this cause, they have take up the task of educating the underprivileged children from nearby adopted village Chandrawal. Apart from teaching them the lessons from their course books, they have also initiated to develop the overall personalities of these kids by involving in fun and innovative activities with them.



SWACHHTHA PAKHWADA(1-15th August): It was a 15 daylong event, which included oath seminar and discussion on the first day, cleanliness drive in college campus and door to door visit and cleanliness drive in adopted Chandrawal village were, volunteers also visited nearby Hindu Rao Hospital, event was concluded with a cleanliness rally in the adopted slum area.



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INDEPENDENCE DAY (15TH AUGUST):- On the 14th of August, the students and volunteers of National Service Scheme celebrated the 72nd Independence Day. The students were told about the importance of 15th August as an Indian citizen and were made aware about those freedom fighters too whose names weren't highlighted in the history. They were told about the sacrifices of freedom fighters made for the upcoming generations to live independently. A few budding students also came forward to say a few lines about the freedom fighters that they idolize. In the end, a speech was also given by our Principal Ma'am and Programme Officer Dr. Benu Gupta to motivate our students.



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BASIC COMMODITIES COLLECTION DRIVE(20th-23rd August)- It was organized in the wake of unprecedented floods in Kerala, students and staff members made a generous contribution of basic elementary materials.

TEACHER'S DAY (5TH SEPTEMBER):- On 5th September the students of National Service Scheme recognized the efforts of the teachers. To mark this day, drawing and essay writing competition were held, with the topic being 'शिक्षाजीवनकाआधारहै।'. Senior students of NSS also gave a speech on Teacher's Day in Hindi and English highlighting the importance of celebrating the day. The event was graced by the presence of honorable principal ma'am Ms. Vibha Singh Chauhan, who interacted with the students. They told that it is a day of mourning for the Shia community and a day of fasting for the Sunni community.



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THE CELEBRATION OF NSS DAY (24th September)- All the volunteers of NSS, Kirori Mal College gathered in library lawn and there was a review of activities of both the wings SAHAS and SAHYOG and post this, a small rally was organized to mark the NSS Day.



BREAKING THE CHAINS (24th September)-

A three week online campaign was initiated on 24 September 2018, on the theme 'Breaking the Chains'. The campaign was carried out on all the social platforms by members of SAHAS- NSS, Kirori Mal College. The campaign was a culmination of issues pertaining to gender equality, women empowerment & recent amendments like Section 377 and Section 497 in the Indian Constitution. Through the medium of this campaign, the veracity of several myths and doubts centring on women empowerment and notions of gender were questioned.

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and interpretations were put forth regarding the new judgement directing towards the fact that women shall not be treated as a commodity.

STRESS MANAGEMENT SEMINAR (3rd October)- An interactive seminar was organized with Dr. Nitin Saraswat, Founder at Moulding Thoughts on Wednesday, 3 October, 2018. The speaker interacted with the audience and tried to burst the myths surrounding the term 'Stress' and its overuse in present narrative. It was a learning experience for everyone realising the need of overpowering stress.
