The panellists discussed their start-up REVY Environmental Solutions Pvt. Ltd. and how they got their breakthrough with the Nascent Entrepreneurship Development Program.

On 28th February 2022, the third lecture of the International Lecture Series, Colloquium on 'Powering the planet using Electrochemistry' was organised. Dr. Mark D Symes, FRSC, School of Chemistry, University of Glasgow, UK was the eminent speaker. Dr. Mark D Symes talked about atmospheric CO₂ and its effect on climate.

An event in collaboration with NSS was organized on the occasion of International Women's Day titled 'Women and Science: The unending journey' on 10th March with Dr. Pragya Yadav as the eminent speaker. She is Sr. Scientist, head of the biosafety laboratory, National Institute of Virology, Pune. She delivered a talk on the fight against pandemics, immunogenicity and protective efficacy of vaccine models.

The ChemSoc and Seminar Committee of Kirori Mal College have also organized various events collaborating with DBT Star College Scheme, Govt. of India. A Webinar on "Hands-On Workshop on UV-Vis Spectroscopy and Its Applications" was organized on 19th July 2021, under the aegis of the DBT Star College Scheme. The

workshop, presided over by Dr Kiran Arora and Dr Ruchi Sharma Pandey, was organized to give students hands-on experience with UV-Vis Spectroscopy and to understand its applications in Chemistry.

Likewise, under the same scheme, we collaborated with IIT Bombay for a 5-day Student Development Programme (SDP) from 10th January 2022 to 14th January 2022, which witnessed more than 110 students' active participation. The Programme focused on Virtual labs and how this has an application in teaching students without any risk exposure.

Along similar lines, a 5-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) was organized in collaboration with Mizoram University under PMMMNMTT and the event saw huge participation from 94 faculty members from different parts of the country and the world.

The Khurusos-Annual Festival of the Department of Chemistry was held on 22nd April 2022, on 'New Trends in Chemical Sciences' by Dr. Sanjeev Kr. Varshney, Adviser & Head - International Cooperation, DST, Government of India. Congratulating the audience on Earth day, he asked students to be active researchers and he further talked about the avenues, and opportunities available to the students. This was followed by a quiz competition dedicated to mother Earth on Earth Day and we carried out other student-related activities.

The fourth edition of Colloquium-the International Lecture Series is scheduled for 28th August 2022 in which we will be hosting Dr. Timothy F. Scott, Associate Dean-Graduate Research, Faculty of Engineering, Department of Chemical and Biological Engineering, Department of Materials Science & Engineering, Monash University, Australia, who will be delivering the talk on 'Polymer Science and Materials Chemistry' on 28th April 2022.

The activities in this momentous year have been carried out with the active cooperation of Principal Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan, led by Teacher-Incharge Dr. Palash Jyoti Das under the Convenorship of Ram Sunil Kumar Lalji and Co-convenorship of Prof. Geetanjali and members of the Seminar Committee. These events were nicely coordinated and executed by President ChemSoc-Yousuf Khan, Vice President- Arihant Yadav and a team of General Secretaries Nishant, Suhani, Rishima and executive members including Ishika, Shreya, Ananya, Avni, Mridul, Neha, Pravesh Prakash Nair, Reeya and Coordinators Arun and Arunabh.



All in all, The theme of Comércio is to provide a platform to people to share their opinion and knowledge so that our readers could benefit from it.


8. Department of Computer Science


Core Team Selection: December 2021

10. Department of English

Events:

Grubstreet, The Literary Society of the Department of English, began the academic year by joining the ongoing celebration of 'Pride Month' in June 2021, held annually in honour of the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan. The society was keen on exploring the complexities of the LGBTQ+ community, its struggle for acceptance and inclusion. Faraz Arif Ansari's internationally acclaimed short film, *Sisak*, was screened on June 18, followed by a detailed discussion. A week after the film screening, Jeanette Winterson's novel, *Oranges Aren't the Only Fruit*, was discussed in an insightful session on June 24.

On September 2, 2021, a discussion was organised with faculty members, Mr. Rudrashish Chakraborty and Ms. Amrapali Basumatary, on "Afghanistan: An Assortment of Images". Personal experiences, historical perspectives the intersections between literature and politics were discussed in this insightful session. In October, the society organised a discussion on the story "Draupadi" by Mahasweta Devi. A Writer's Anonymous session was held on November 20, 2021. These are events at which students submit their writing anonymously and are given feedback without any kind of judgement. As always, it reiterated Grubstreet as a safe space for expression.

The Orientation for the students of the first year took place on November 20. Freshers joined it in great numbers and were briefed about the society's working and its annual events. This was followed by an informal interactive session among the students of the department.

A short story discussion on "The Lottery" by Shirley Jackson was conducted on January 18, 2022.

Grubstreet organised its first academic talk of the year in February. Dr. Maaz Bin Bilal, Associate Professor, Jindal Global University, spoke on "Fikr 'Tanzvi', The Satirist: Hoping for No More Rivers of Blood", on February 4. He highlighted how there was a certain quality of dissociation and detachment possessed by Tanzvi and how there is a conscious attempt by the writer to write himself into art. On February 25, an academic conversation with author Manreet Sodhi Someshwar on her novel Lahore, the first part of her Partition Trilogy, was organised, wherein she explained how her hometown Ferozpur, Punjab, made her a writer and her novel focuses on finding how the past is still with us.

With classes finally back to campus, Grubstreet organised an informal-house session 'Conversation on Poetry and Music' on March 3. To commemorate International Women's Day, a lecture on women and crime in the literary canon and art, titled "The Kitchen is where the Knives are: Anxious Type castings and Women in Crime" by Ms. Mousumi Ray, Associate Professor, ARSD College, was organised on March 9.

Grubstreet is planning to organise its annual fest 'Bohemia' as a two-day event on April 4 and 5, with the first day being dedicated to academic events. A lecture on "Cinema and Sound" by Dr. Vebhuti Duggal, Assistant Professor, Ambedkar University Delhi, will be followed by an interactive Script Writing Workshop by film maker and KMC alumnus, Kislay. Competitions for students will be organised on the second day of the fest.

The society also intends to hold a seminar on Speculative Fiction for which abstracts have been invited and a talk as well as student presentations have been scheduled for April 19 and 20. A special issue of the department magazine, Palimpsest, will be published on the theme of Speculative Fiction, incorporating the papers presented in the seminar as well as other relevant submissions.

The society plans to conclude the Academic Year with a farewell for the batch of 2022.

Council:

On August 4, 2021, Council elections were held. 100 Years' of Jallianwala Bagh

Movie Screening and Interactive Session-2nd September, 2021

Legacy - The History Society of Kirori Mal College, organized a Movie Screening and an Interactive Session on 100 Years of Jallianwala Bagh, a Documentary by Mujibar Rahman, a notable filmmaker and writer, based in Kolkata, West Bengal; and produced by EZCC, Kolkata, Ministry of Culture, Government of India. This event marked the beginning of a new academic year filled with new energy and enthusiasm. Shambhavi Jha and Aakanksha Singh officially started the event with a brief introduction of the Department and recalling various events of the past and with a zeal to make this another academic year a success, with an objective to leave behind a Legacy.

The event commenced further with the host, Purbasha Mukherjee, calling for the observance of one-minute silence in remembrance of all the people we have lost in the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic. The host further calls upon Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan, Principal of KMC, who congratulates the participants for initiating a programme “which is exceptional in many ways”.

Principal ma'am extends her warm welcome to Mujibar Rahman and praises him for filming an “epical” event and for recreating the incident for all of us. She acknowledges the hard work put behind the work, well-researched biographies, adding a lot more to the History of India of that period and acknowledging the human aspects involved in history. She extends her gratitude to Mujibar Sir for making a film with great deal of attention, and for bringing this wonderful work to us. She also congratulates Prof. Dhiraj Kumar, Prof. Amit Kumar Suman and the entire team for making this event possible, for their curiosity and for understanding the relevance of the event. Teacher-in-Charge, Prof. Dhiraj Kumar welcomes Mujibar Rahman, acknowledging his great work of historical research and contributing to various debates attached to it.

“It was a horrible duty I had to perform. I think it was a merciful thing; I thought that I should shoot well and shoot strong so that I or nobody else should not have to shoot again. I think it is quite possible that I could have dispersed the crowd without firing but they would have come back again and laughed and I should have made what I consider to be a fool of myself.” Mujibar Rahman, mesmerized with the warm welcome, starts by quoting these lines of General Dyer and he lets his film speak for him first. He also extends his gratitude to EZCC for trusting him to make a film on such a serious subject like Jallianwala Bagh and which has already completed its hundred years. It was a challenging task to present the entire event in a time frame of 60 minutes.

He shares his methodology where he talked to various history professors in detail and he studied the latest books published on the subject. With his research he came to a conclusion that taking a decision of organizing a mass-killing event “was not a temporary or instant decision” taken by the Britishers. “It was a long term conspiracy taken up by the Britishers”. “And General Dyer was not the only person who took the decision”. He also comments on the motive of the Britishers behind such a heinous act that there was a series of events in Amritsar before 13th of April which made the Britishers frightened, especially the “Ram Navami” festival of 9 April, 1919, where the British officers observed the “unity of Hindus and Muslims”. This unity disturbed them as they had already experienced this in the Revolt Of 1857. Hence, they took the decision to give a lesson to the Indians.

The movie was wonderfully made. It had an impact on all its viewers. The students were enriched and overwhelmed with the documentary and this was followed up by a great discussion on the topic. The curiosity of the audience was also commendable. The Amritsar Tragedy was a turning point in Indo-British relations almost as important as the mutiny of 1857. The film documented various views of common people, eminent scholars and researchers.

It brought to light various names and descriptions that most people were not aware of. It made us live and understand the importance of that particular day and event. “Their blood strain still scream, their helplessness still haunts, their sacrifice still honoured.”

After an exhaustive session of Question and Answer, Durrain spoke on the Documentary, representing the Student body and their views. PAITKAR PAINTING WITH PROF. SEEMA BAWA, MR. KISHORE GAYEN AND MR. SWAROOP GAYEN- 7th September, 2021

LEGACY – THE HISTORY SOCIETY OF KIRORIMAL COLLEGE, DELHI UNIVERSITY, on 7th September, 2021, organised a webinar, on the digital platform Google Meet, titled “NARRATIVE TRADITION IN FOLK ART” with special emphasis on PAITKAR PAINTING. Host Priyanshi Khandelwal commenced the event at 11.30 AM, beginning with an introduction of the theme, followed by address by Teacher-in-Charge Prof. Dheeraj & Staff Advisor Prof. Amit Kumar Suman who addressed our chief speaker, Prof. Seema Bawa, the Head of History Department of the University and our special guests, Mr. Kishore Gayen and Mr. Swaroop Gayen. Hon'ble Principal ma'am, Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan, who herself has been involved in projects on the tribal arts of India, delivered an addressing note tagging along the contemporary importance of folk art and tradition. A concise theme description was provided by Shakti to make the audience aware, followed by a welcome note for Ms. Seema Bawa extended by Aashi.

Prof. Seema Bawa very cheerfully began her speech on the significance of folk art by citing various examples from Indian history. She talked about the writing and singing style of Paitkar artists, how gender played a role in their paintings, the paintings depict their daily lives and a lot more. Most importantly, she talked about the adaptability of narratives selected by the artists to accompany their painting, providing the example of eminent painter Ganga Devi, whose work was very much based on her personal life and explorations. The first time the artist had seen an airplane, she couldn't help but sketch one in her upcoming artworks. Prof. Bawa beautifully ended her speech by conveying the importance of keeping the art alive and what degradation has lack of art history caused to the present thinkers.

At around 12:10 AM, Mr. Kishore Gayen was invited to familiarise the audience about his craft. He talked about how they want to make this their full-time work and diffuse the fine tradition of Paitkar Kalaa but the lack of marketing prospects kept their hands tied. On popular request, he then went on to present a live demonstration of how the colours are made naturally from rocks and painted a few strokes on his sheet which made the session even more lively.

Followed by this, Mr. Swaroop Gayen, introduced his art by singing a melodious, heart-touching composition for all for around ten minutes. He sang his traditional ballad and the joy he felt was apparent on his face. As an old artist, he has quite a lot of intriguing ideas about this practice. He told the viewers how this folk art has deteriorated in the early past and how it has affected their community.

A question-answer round was conducted after this where Purbasha volunteered to play the role of a translator, translating English to Bengali for the special guests that had humbly agreed to join us from Jharkhand. At 12:50 AM, the end note was given with the successful conclusion of the event. The art form had, long before the event, piqued the interest of a few students who then dug deeper into it.

The vibrant, rustic state of Jharkhand dotted with innumerable ethnicities attracts cultural enthusiasts from all around the globe. Home to over 30 tribes, much like its neighbouring states, this land assumes the honour of being the birthplace and reservoir of some of the most unique forms of art and craft that have been handed down to the present generation of its residents for centuries.

Paitkar has been practised by the community addressed by the same name or as Chitrakaars. This artistic fraternity has been striving for long to gather recognition for their sophisticated art. In a bid to prolong the preserved state of their meticulously prepared artworks, they're exploring combinations of synthetic colours as alternatives to the earlier custom of using only the naturally extracted colouring pigments obtained from stones, leaves and other plant parts that attracted insect infestation.

Located in the district of Jamshedpur, the village of Amadubi holds the prestige of germinating the harmonious art of Paitkar at least five centuries ago. Apparently, the reign of Dalbhums witnessed substantial patronisation of the craft when artists took to enticing the rajas into beholding their skillful lyrical performances alongside exhibiting their magnificent scroll paintings in the raj darbar.

For the rajas of the bygone era, the themes featured in Paitkar paintings – drawn from the epics of Ramayan and Mahabharat to the stories of the quotidian kind – were bewitching. But as dismally unfortunate as it is, the contemporary attitude towards the craft is nowhere close to where it once stood. The gales of modernisation snatched away the premium status that many such indigenous crafts had once enjoyed, sweeping them into an ocean of anonymity. In an attempt to bring the art back into lustre, Jharkhand state government's initiatives, particularly the JHARCRAFT programme and designating the mother village of Amadubi the title of a Craft Village, have added a stroke of hope to the canvas of Chitrakaars and to the shelf of the aesthetes.

Out of the total Chitrakaar community in the village, the number of artists that are today engaged in the art can be literally counted on one's fingers, while others have shifted to other more feasible vocations.

Nonetheless, all is not lost since the fine art tradition still stands a chance to bounce back into its earlier stature, epitomizing the richness of the folk culture.

International Seminar, Legacy - 4th & 7th March, 2022

Gender equality as a concept has remained largely evasive in India's history as a republic. Women are underrepresented in every sphere of society. To look at history through a woman's eyes, and to recognise her contribution to the making of it, the history society of Kirori Mal College, Delhi University proudly organized a series of lectures on the occasion of Women's day.

The International Seminar was based on the theme "Gender inequalities and Indian Social Systems" to understand the dynamics of representation of females throughout Indian history. The event took place in the Academic Auditorium of Kirori Mal College, and was open for all Delhi University students. It was organized under the guidance of the department faculty, and convened by senior student Mantasha Kalam.

The college was honoured to host Prof. Kumkum Roy on 4th March 2022 to kick start the event. Prof. Roy taught Ancient Indian History at the Centre for Historical Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Her areas of interest include gender, political institutions, histories of marginalised people as well as in pedagogical issues in the teaching of history. Her publications include *The Power of Gender and the Gender of Power* (2010) and *A Historical Dictionary of Ancient India* (2010), and she has also previously worked with teams involved in the production of school textbooks at the state and national level.

The event began with a solemn remembrance of Dr. BP Sahu. The guests then lit the lamp to begin the event. Our guests were welcomed by the Vice Principal, SK Kaushik and the department's teacher in charge, Prof. Dhiraj Kumar. Momentos and tokens of appreciation were given to the guests, followed by a formal welcome address and introduction to the theme of the International Seminar. Then Prof. Roy graced the audience with her lecture themed, "Rocky Roads to Realisation: Some Reflections on the Wise Women in Early India."

Prof. Roy began with a warm note on the importance of celebrating Women's day and women in history. Her lecture highlighted the contributions and historical depictions of three well-known women of Ancient Indian lore- Sage Gargi, Mahapajapati Gautami, and Sulabha. Prof. Roy narrated the account of the debate between Gargi and Sage Yajnavalkya. She described her brave and courageous demeanor and never ending curiosity, that ultimately angered the Sage. She talked about her representation and what it meant for society. She then moved on to Mahapajapati Gautami, foster mother to the Buddha. Her story and contributions to the Sangha were then discussed. Various aspects of her depictions in different texts and the context behind them were highlighted. Lastly, the account of Sulabha's debate with King Janaka was recounted. The lecture concluded with a comparison of the historical depiction of the three women from varying social contexts of ancient India, and the common factors in their struggles. The women, no matter their background, did not have easy or automatic access to equal rights and platforms. They were exceptional women who had to struggle to fight the entrenched patriarchy that sought to restrict them in various ways.

The enlightening session was followed by a throng of questions by an enthusiastic audience. Prof. Roy interacted with as many students and professors as possible and gave her insights on several topics varying from historical depictions to the ever-going fight against gender bias. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks by the department.

In continuation of the Seminar, Legacy organized another lecture on 7th March, 2022, with guest lecturer Prof. Jaya S Tyagi. Dr. Tyagi has been teaching History in the University of Delhi for the last 33 years. She is also the Director of WSDC (Women's Studies and Development Centre for Advanced Study), and specializes in ancient Indian history and the study of households, religions, rites, and rituals. She has also been a fellow at the Indian Institute of Advanced Studies, Shimla (2010-2012). Dr. Tyagi's lecture in accordance with the theme of the event was titled, "Gendered Negotiations and Conflicts: Revisiting early Indian Traditions."

The event began once again with the guests of honor lighting the lamp, followed by memento and token of appreciation being offered to Dr. Tyagi. Then the Vice Principal formally welcomed Dr Tyagi to address the gathering.

Dr Tyagi began her lecture by drawing attention towards historians like Uma Chakravati and Kumkum Roy who are the pioneers of the study of women in ancient Indian history. She then stated that Historians should be on their tenterhooks when talking about ancient India because very little is known about it. Historians must be even more careful when talking about gender in ancient India, as it is the primary way of signifying the relationship of power. Approaching social sciences from a gendered perspective helps decode the complex connections between human interactions. Power is discursive and is embodied in discourse, knowledge and epistemological traditions.

Dr. Tyagi quoted historians like Judith Butler and John Scott to show how the understanding of gender has evolved, and how it can vary with context.

She explained how gender is the constituted element of social relationships based on perceived differences between the sex. Women are usually only in the context of their relationship with a man, which obstructs her from forming her own agency. There is a need to unlink women from their husbands, kinsmen and kinswomen and then only we can see what a woman is on her own. Women have continuously negotiated for spaces, resources, decision making capacity and recognition. The concept of women's agency and if it really led to empowerment was explored at length. Dr. Tyagi concluded with a comment on the need to study women as separate entities, not as a homogenous category.

The lecture was followed by a string of questions by the eager audience, which Dr. Tyagi happily entertained. The event concluded with a note of humble gratitude towards the honourable guests and audience that made the Seminar a great success.

KM Ashraf Memorial Lecture -9th March, 2022

Legacy: The History Society of Kirori Mal College successfully organized an exhilarating lecture to commemorate the legacy of Prof. Kunwar Mohammad Ashraf (1903-1962) on March 9, 2022. The K.M Ashraf Memorial lecture was based on the theme "Gender inequalities and Indian Social Systems" to understand the dynamics of representation of females throughout Indian history. The event took place virtually and was open for all Delhi University students.

The event began with an introduction of Professor K.M Ashraf. Then Prof. Lal graced the audience with her lecture themed, "The Small Things of History: The Question of the Archive and the Great Mughal, Nur Jahan". She began with a narrative of the morning of 23 October 1619, when the twentieth wife and empress of Jahangir leads a retinue to a forest near Mathura, to flush out and kill a tiger that had been terrorizing a nearby village. While the sole purpose is to bring down the tiger, the party that heads out has all the leisurely pace, pomp and ritual of an imperial pageant. Her lecture highlighted the contributions and historical depictions of Nur Jahan.

Professor talked about how the Empress was at the centre of one of the largest empires of the world, Nur Jahan, the twentieth and supposedly the most loved wife of Mughal emperor Jahangir, who has been a household name in the Subcontinent. To honour his new beautiful and faithful wife, Jahangir gave her the title of Nur Jahan (lit. 'Light of the World').

She told the narrative of a woman from the imperial harem, but without the usual concern with the harem as a source of cheap erotica. She told an engrossing story, with its rich detail recreating a world whose bloodline constraints would appear to bar the arrival of an unknown, self-made, widowed queen. She talked about Nur Jahan's contribution as a sign of sovereignty and an indication that her power was growing.

Professor Lal placed the male-centred animosity against Nur Jahan, during her own time and retrospectively, after her death – fitna, meaning chaos or disorder being the word repeatedly used in reference to her – in the orthodox Islamic thought of the times. Professor Ruby Lal, delved into Nur Jahan's fascinating life and world, rescuing her from patriarchal and orientalist cliches of romance and intrigue while also providing new insight into the lives of women and girls during the Mughal Empire, even where scholars claim there are no sources. Nur's self-assured assertion of authority and brilliance was eye-opening. She weaved together an appealing biographical biography of Nur Jahan by charting her life history and placing her in the context of Mughal India's heterogeneous cultural environment.

The enlightening session was followed by a throng of questions by an enthusiastic audience. Prof. Ruby Lal interacted with as many students and professors as possible and gave her insights on several topics varying from historical depictions to the ever-going fight against gender bias. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks by the department. The Convener of K.M Ashraf Committee Mantasha Kalam thanked professor for her engrossing lecture. The webinar was attended by over 100 participants and it turned out to be a great success.

Department Trip to Udaipur-Mount Abu - 25th-30th March, 2022

On 25th March 2022, 60 students along with 4 teachers (Amit Suman, Sumit Kumar, Altaf Hussain and Dushyant Jha) embarked upon the journey to Udaipur and Mount Abu for an education trip. It is the historical capital of the Mewar kingdom in the old Rajputana Agency and was formed in 1559 by Udai Singh II of the Rajput Sisodia line, who relocated his headquarters from Chittorgarh to Udaipur when Chittorgarh was besieged by Akbar. It remained the capital city until 1818, when it became a British princely state, and the Mewar region was included into Rajasthan when India got independence in 1947.

The expedition was planned with the goal of a deeper understanding of the local history and the accounts of historical events that we read about in various historical texts. An attempt was made to comprehend the local population's folklore. The trip lasted 6 days, from the 25th to the 30th of March, including a two-night stay in Udaipur and a one-night stay at Mount Abu.

Sites visited in Udaipur included Fatehsagar, Saheliyon ki Bari, Udaipur City Palace, Chhitorgarh Fort complex, and others, while Mount Abu included Dilwara Temple, Nakki Lake, Guru Shikhar, and Achaleshwar Mahadev Temple. On the way back to Delhi, the students had the opportunity to visit the Ajmer Shareef Dargah and experience qawali and devotional practises. The students were given the opportunity to learn about the city's cuisine as well as the local attire and lifestyle culture. Upon their return, each student was assigned the responsibility of writing a paper/report based on their experiences and observations during the trip.

Paper presentation Competition - 7th April 2022

South Asia has been home to some of the oldest civilizations known to mankind, and its cultures have existed in a cosmopolitan, interconnected and ever-changing continuum that spans millennia. Yet as anyone well-versed in history would know, an all-

encompassing label is not enough to capture the socio-cultural, economic, political and geographical diversity and nuances of a region that houses half the world's population.

The History Society of Kirori Mal College, has always been driven with a passion for exploring and revisiting the uncharted territories of the past, and approaching the discipline of history through a holistic lens. As such, this initiative is yet another step in Legacy's aim of facilitating inclusive, path breaking research.

To retain a history as opulent as that of South Asia, the KMC Journal of South Asian Studies - an endeavor spearheaded by LEGACY - The History Society, Kirori Mal College aims to focus on providing an accessible and holistic platform to scholarship related to the subcontinent. It will be an annual publication, acting as a compendium of works of scholars as well as students. The discipline of History does not exist in an intellectual vacuum. Thus, in an effort to give space to the student researchers platform to share their work, we are inviting undergraduate and graduate students from all over India to participate in our Paper Presentation conference, which will be organized on 7th April, 2022.

Equality, more specifically, gender equality as a concept has largely remained evasive in India's history as a republic nation. The discrimination starts from even before the girl child is born. In many instances, she is prevented from being born. The girl child is considered a burden. She is often deprived of the basic rights and equal opportunities to lead a wholesome childhood and adult life. To understand the past through a woman's eye, our theme of celebrating women in history, the theme of the presentation is "Breaking Barriers: Representing Women in South Asian History". The event will take place in the college premises in hybrid mode. For papers to reach to the echelons of awareness, it has to go through a procedure of critical scrutiny for the purpose of which each paper will go through a peer-review process, overseen by our team of esteemed professors and scholars and most importantly our venerable panel.

For this year's paper presentation we feel honored to have with us in our panel, Dr. Saifuddin Ahmad (Assistant Professor, Faculty of Social Sciences, Delhi University), Dr. Richa Raj (Assistant Professor, Department of History, Jesus and Mary College), Retired Prof. Kumar Amarendra Singh (Department of History, Kirori Mal College). Each step of the journey, from curating papers and reviews, to peer reviewing, to publication, alongside the various events will be handled by the Editorial Board. This board comprises solely of students.

We plan to welcome a set of at least ten research papers scrutinized thoroughly for the day's event and have set the time at ten minutes for every participating team including their presentation on the screen. The presentation will be followed by a question answer session that will facilitate transparent understanding of the arguments being discussed and will furthermore make the event more fruitful and exciting.

Finally, research in academia has long seemed unapproachable for most students. The nuances of academic writing, along with the ethics of research and the often-cumbersome process of publication make the job very daunting for many. 
Webinar on Fundamentals of Laser-Induced Breakdown Spectroscopy (LIBS) by Mr. Vishal Dwivedi, Comenius University, Slovakia

A webinar was organized for the Students of Physics Department by Physics Seminar Society on October 25, 2021 through Zoom platform.

Topic of the Webinar: Fundamentals of Laser-Induced Breakdown Spectroscopy (LIBS)

Our Key Speaker for the programme was Mr. Vishal Dwivedi who is presently a Ph.D. student at Comenius University, Slovakia. It feels proud to mention that Mr. Vishal Dwivedi is an alumnus of our Department. A total of around 80 students and faculty members from Physics Department attended the programme.

Laser-induced breakdown spectroscopy (LIBS) is a powerful analytical technique that can be used to detect and characterize materials. Mr. Vishal explained the technique to the students and also highlighted the importance of this technique. The session was very informative and Mr. Vishal, being an alumnus of the Department was successful in greatly motivating the students of our Department towards higher studies. Online Faculty development Program on Programming in Python

Python Language has emerged as an efficient tool in the practice of science teaching at different levels. The solution to problems along with visual representations of the same is believed to effectively articulate the associated methodologies and has been an impetus to the widespread usage of this tool. In this light, the Department of Physics, Kirori Mal College hosted a Faculty Development Program (FDP) on **Programming in Python** under the **Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNT)** centre of Mizoram University, on a digital platform, during December 6th - 10th 2021. The timings of sessions were from 2:00 to 6:00 P.M each day. Prof. Rakesh Kumar Pandey served as the program coordinator and Dr. Sangeeta D. Gadre and Dr. Kajal Jindal served as program co-coordinators. The FDP focused on the application of Python programming and covered the syllabus of undergraduate honours courses in Delhi University wherein Python programming is recommended. The participants were successfully exposed to application of Python programming in the problems related to Algebraic equations, Differential equations, Boundary value Problems, Matrices – equations and operations, Eigenvalue problems, Graphical displays, Quantum Mechanics and Statistical Mechanics. The participants included teachers engaged in undergraduate teaching of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science and other such subjects in different colleges of University of Delhi and also across universities. 49 participants registered for the program. The program included the lectures as well as hands on interactive sessions. The participants were given assignments through Google classroom and were assessed there.

Overall, the program was highly fruitful and proved to be a great opportunity for all the participants to enrich their knowledge on a platform where faculty members from different colleges or institutes came together and had an interactive learning experience. All the participants were awarded the graded certificate of completion of program.



Departmental educational tour

Field trips are an integral part of the teaching and learning process as per the recent studies. Due to the unprecedented times of COVID-19 unfortunately, students could not be exposed to much practical knowledge. Thus, Physics society organized an educational tour for the students of B.Sc. (H) Physics III year to Rishikesh. 48 students of third year Physics Hons were taken for a tour to the Chilla Power Plant situated between Hardwar and Rishikesh on April 13-14 2022. Pashulok barrage is a barrage located on the Ganges river in Rishikesh to divert water into a canal on the east bank of the river which feeds water to the Chilla Power Plant downstream at $29^{\circ}58'34''\text{N}$ $78^{\circ}13'11''\text{E}$, 4 km (2 mi) upstream of Haridwar. This hydroelectric power station contains four 36 megawatts (48,000 hp) Kaplan turbine-generators for an installed capacity of renewable energy of 144 megawatts (193,000 hp).

A visit like this enhanced the understanding of the students about a class of renewable energy that is produced using potential and kinetic energy of water. The students were accompanied by 9 teachers from the Department of Physics.



17. Department of Political Science





He addressed the structural aspects of the annual financial statement in detail, unravelling the timeline and analysing the key aspects of the budget.

He gave a perception of the ongoing budgetary and GDP trends, relating it with the Indian economics and macroeconomics for our better understanding. Later he presented the implications of the Budget 2022-23, discussed the major policies and gave an insight on how this budget will impact our day to day life.



Research Bootcamp

Date: 22nd - 24th February 2022

With immense vigour and enthusiasm, The Seminar Committee, Department of Economics, and The Economics Society, Kirori Mal College had organized a 'Research Bootcamp' from 22nd to 24th February 2022. This three-day Bootcamp was divided into six very insightful sessions and workshops covering a wide range of topics and ideas. The aim was to further the cause of academic research across all domains by motivating the students and acquainting them with the basics of writing effective and unique research papers.

On the first day, sessions on 'Getting started with Research in Economics' and 'Old Wine in New Bottles- Some Observations on Current Research Practices' were addressed by our guest speakers Dr. Priyanka Arora (Ashoka University) and Dr. Mrinalini Jha (Azim Premji University), respectively. Primarily, these sessions dealt with all the things a person should be aware of while starting with a research paper. Adding to that, the sessions also catered to some commonly faced difficulties familiarising students with the basics of structuring an academic paper, along with detailed explanations about plagiarism and citations.

On the second day, Dr. Vineeta Sharma of Kirori Mal College and Dr. Divya Gupta of OP Jindal University threw light on the topics like 'Data Journeys in Evidence-based Research' and 'Field Surveys and Questionnaire Design' respectively. During the sessions, the speakers not just addressed different approaches that can be used for collecting the necessary data but also explained the importance and significance of each approach. They particularly focused on primary research, field surveys, and questionnaire design as a meaningful way of economic data collection.

Lastly, on the third day, the students witnessed a session on 'Tableau basics' and 'Transforming Data into Action' by Seraj Alam (Iris Software Inc), enlightening us on learning data analytics using tableau. Both the speakers had a common opinion that the collected data if not analyzed and visualized properly will be totally wasted efforts. They further added that using tableau is very important for an effective research paper these days. It simplifies and summarises a massive amount of raw data into an easily understandable format, making it quicker to produce reports and draw conclusions.

All the sessions and workshops were interactive where the speakers addressed every query, suggestion, or idea that came along their way during the session to give a better perspective to the students.



Cultural Societies

1. DEBSOC

DEBSOC - the Debating Society, KMC started the year 2021-22 in online mode, which had become the new normal in the debating circuits. The year before this had seen a major fall in debating activities as the students were still not used to online debating. The new mode picked up quite rapidly this year with all the major tournaments being held with good participation. As the University opened in mid-February 2022, the debating fraternity was delighted to go back to the offline tournaments organized by a few colleges, including us, with great enthusiasm. Debsoc KMC successfully organized two of the most prestigious annual debating tournaments offline – The Frank Thakurdas Memorial Debate and the NS Pradhan Memorial Debate. The motions debated at FTD and NSP were both intriguing and challenging and spanned a variety of themes – history, politics, economics, philosophy, gender and popular culture. As all the members of the society, including the senior batch had hardly any experience in conducting tournaments of this scale offline, the dedicated hard work they put in to make this possible is highly praiseworthy.

The English wing of Debsoc organized the 41st edition of its flagship event, the Frank Thakurdas Memorial Debate, on 9th -11th April 2022 on campus. 32 highly competitive teams and about 100 adjudicators from prestigious colleges across the country participated in the tournament, making it a grand success. Kamala Nehru College emerged as the winners of the FTD/41, taking home the FTD rolling cup. The runner-up was Delhi College of Arts and Commerce. We were very generously supported in this effort by the reputed entrepreneur Aditya Ghosh, our alumni and former President of Debsoc, and his organization Homage.

The Hindi wing of Debsoc organized the 31st Narendra Singh Pradhan Memorial Debate Tournament offline on 23rd -25th April 2022, wherein 42 teams participated. The winners were a cross team from Campus Law Centre and Department of Physics and the Runner up was a team from the Arts Faculty, DU.

The Hindi wing also organized the Fresher's tournament Udbhav online on 12 and 13 February 2022, wherein 32 teams participated. The winning team was from Hansraj College and the Runner up team was from Shivaji College. Apart from this, they organized a debating competition as a part of the celebration Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav on 13 October 2022. Our members were very active in all the tournaments held throughout this year and achieved distinctions both as debaters and adjudicators by participating in tournaments organized by various colleges of the University and other educational institutions. For the Hindi wing the most notable achievements are Best Institution award at Jaswant Kaur Memorial Debate conducted by Satyawati College, Winner of Savitri Bai Phule memorial Conventional Debate conducted by Moti Lal Nehru College, Winner of Kapil Ratnu Freshers Parliamentary debate conducted by Ramjas college and Runner up positions at Zakir Hussain Day College Parliamentary Debate and Rajdhani College Conventional Debate. For the English wing some of the most notable achievements were reaching the semi-finals at Munazraah organised by Kamla Nehru College, the semi-finals at Fresher's Debate organized by Guru Govind Singh College; the finals in the Novice category at IIT Delhi British Parliamentary Debate as well as the Octo-finals at Chanakya National Law University Parliamentary Debate. Our members also distinguished themselves in adjudication. Particularly notable are the adjudication prizes at Rahat Parliamentary Debate, GGS Fresher's Debate, LSR PD, DNLU PD and FTD'41.

Apart from this the members of the society worked throughout the year in regular practice sessions which involved training the juniors, holding mock sessions and brainstorming to create innovative motions for debating. The Hindi wing also organized a two weeks online open session for training, where any student was free to join. With the resumption of debating competitions in the physical mode and the students interacting with each other in person, both the level and intensity of activities are expected to be even higher next year.




2. Barrie Keeffe's 'SUS', in an adaptation in Hindi directed by Abhipsito Das and Anmol Nailwal;
3. Sandeep Shikhar's 'Treadmill', in an adaptation, directed by Jagriti Pandey and Shrey Chowdhry.

These plays are still being worked on and are expected to go into performance in June 2022.

Credit for keeping the society functioning smoothly in these difficult times (both in on-line form and, from mid-February 2022, in on-site form) must go to its student Office Bearers, Harshini Misra (President), Abhipsito Das and Janavi Chawla (Secretaries).




Student Empowerment Societies/Cells





Living up to its remarkable legacy, the club succeeded in pulling off incredibly successful events in July.



- **The Van Mahotsav Week:** Plantation drive and various competitions:-


- **International Tiger Day:-**


The mid-year successfully encountered a few events bringing people altogether in the period where many are left aloof leaving us to spend the rest half waiting eagerly for more such meetings.





The judges went through all the performances carefully and selected the three best among them and also provided them with the feedback to improve their art.


Amarnath, Praful, and Radhakant Rout bagged the first, second, and third positions respectively. Sanjay and Om received a special mention for their efforts.




BHOOMI - SEPTEMBER REPORT


BUTTERFLY BOOTCAMP SESSION:-

- **OPEN DISCUSSION:-**






IDOL IMMERSION AWARENESS POST:-




A dossier of Bhoomi's January initiatives:-





March:-








Many students went back home taking the knowledge and eventually prepared 'natural colors' at home. This ensured an eco-friendly holi!


The goal was to sensitize students on correct menstrual hygiene




practices by means of an attention-grabbing but also more comprehensible form of presentation which also facilitated their understanding.

It strives to function as a nodal institutional site to produce, systemize and disseminate academic knowledge about disability. The Centre engages with all aspects of disability experience ranging from the sociology of the phenomenon, its representations in literature and culture, disability politics and policies, disability law and human rights, to accessibility and universal design, inclusion and education, capacity building and skill development, professional training and employment.

But above all, it aims to empower the disabled community through the creation of multiple opportunities and platforms for their sustainable socio-economic, academic and professional upliftment.

In the pursuit of the above goal, the Centre in its inaugural year has organised a wide range of academic and sensitization activities, from faculty development programs and certificate courses to international conferences, webinars and awareness workshops surrounding disability studies.

Academic Activities

The Centre initiated its academic endeavour with a Certificate Course on Disability Studies in collaboration with Saksham. This spanned over 4 weeks, comprising 22 lectures with the objective to orient disability studies as a liberating, inclusive epistemology that problematizes and rethinks notions and hierarchies of ableism.

This Certificate Course was a pilot project conducted from 22nd of February to 19th of March 2021 prior to the inception of the Centre. Its resounding success inevitably led to the creation of CDRT and its engagement with a wide range of academic activities.

The inaugural academic engagement of the Centre was a two day National Webinar on "Conceptualising Disability and Disability Studies" with Dr. Shilpa Das (National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad) on the 27th and 29th of September, 2021. This was followed by a five-day International Webinar from the 4th to the 8th of October, 2021, on "Why does Disability Research Matter" The resource persons for this event included Prof. Nicholas Watson (University of Glasgow), Prof. Shilpa Das (National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad), Prof. Dan Goodley (University of Sheffield), Prof. Eva Feder Kittay (Stony Brook University), Prof. Margrit Shildrick (Stockholms University), Prof. Stephen Kuusisto (Syracuse University), Prof. Dr. Anne Waldschmidt (University of Cologne), Prof. Amita Dhanda (NALSAR University of Law Hyderabad), Mr. Dipendra Manocha (Founding Managing Trustee Saksham), Prof. Gregor Strutz (inkl.Design GmbH - Agency for inclusive Design Berlin), and Prof. Lennard Davis (University of Illinois).

Towards the end of the year, the Centre also hosted the IDSC (Indian Disabilities Studies Collective) International Conference on the topic "Disability: Resistance, Disruption and Transgression", spread over 5 days from 29th of November to 3rd of December of 2021. The keynote of the conference was delivered by Prof. Tom Shakespeare (London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine) and its valedictory note by Prof. Anita Ghai (Ambedkar University, Delhi). The plenary speakers included Prof. Stephen Kuusisto (Syracuse University), Prof. Sandhya Limaye (Tata Institute of Social Sciences), Prof. Fiona Kumari Campbell (University of Dundee, Scotland) amongst others.

More than 60 disability scholars from all parts of the country and

the world presented their views and discussed the various aspects of disability culture production, academics, and activism. The Conference concluded by laying stress on the need to disrupt and transgress normative perceptions of disability and unsettle the ablist power structures.

Furthermore, from the 17th - 21st of January, 2021, the Centre in collaboration with the Xavier's Resource Centre for the Visually Challenged (XRCVC), St. Xavier's College, Mumbai and Mizoram University, organised a week long interdisciplinary Faculty Development Program, "Inclusive Pedagogy: Engaging Students with Disabilities". The goal of this program was to develop an understanding of the various disabilities and how to accommodate them in the classroom.

The Centre also conducted a Certificate Course from the 16th of February to the 20th of April, 2022 in collaboration with the National Centre for Promotion of Employment for Disabled People (NCPEDP) on, "An Introduction to Disabilities Research: A Legal and Social Studies Perspective." The prime objective of this course was to develop an understanding of disability laws and its relevant concepts, the significance of disability law, rights and advocacy in an inclusive society, and to train and encourage students to carry out research in the field.

Aiming to broaden the knowledge base of disability studies, the Centre actively encouraged undergraduate students to engage with disability research under the expert mentorship of renowned disability studies scholars. For this purpose in the months of January and February, the Centre organised a series of mentoring sessions with Prof. Shubhangi Vaidya (IGNOU) on Disability and Care, Family, Society & Cinema on 14th January 2022, Prof Renu Addlakha (Centre for Women's Development Studies) on Disability and Gender on 15th January, 2022, Mr. Sandeep R. Singh (Ambedkar University, Delhi) on Disability, Literature and Culture

on the 16th January, and 5th February, 2022, Prof. Papia Sengupta (JNU) on Disability Law, Rights and Policies on the 26th January, 2022, and Prof. Sandhya Limaye (TISS) on Disability in Education, Employment and Deaf Studies on 29th January, 2022. These sessions were specifically designed to help the students to evolve their own projects and understand the various layered nuances of research.

With the view of encouraging the students to carry out research, the Centre organised “Dhristikon”, a one-day colloquium on "Disability and Hindi Cinema" on the 6th of April, 2022, in the Academic Auditorium of Kirori Mal College. The resource persons for this event were Dr. Ravikant (Centre for the study of Developing Societies), Dr. Mithuraj Dhusiya (Hanraj College, DU), Ms. Mansi Grover (Jamia Millia Islamia University), and Ms. Priyam Sinha (National University of Singapore).

The resource persons dwelt upon the representation of disability in Bollywood and critiqued the predominantly flawed portrayal of the phenomenon in Hindi films. However, they also brought into the purview of the discussion, movies like “Dosti”, “Koshish” and “Margarita with a Straw” which effectively portrayed the various complexities of the lived experiences of disability. To carry this research interest further, the Centre plans to organise a 3-day workshop in May on the same theme.

Sensitization Workshops

In addition to fostering academic interest in disability studies, the Centre has organised a number of sensitization workshops and community awareness campaigns on disability.

In March 2022, the first offline event of CDRT, "Sanket" - a Sign Language Awareness Workshop was conducted, in collaboration with the Indian Sign Language Research & Training Centre,

Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice, Government of India. The workshop, organised in the Academic Auditorium of the college, intended to spread community awareness about sign language and sensitise the students with the experience of what it means to be deaf.

CDRT also aims to conduct “Anubhav” - a sensitization workshop in April 2022, for all students of the college to spread awareness of the different kinds of disabilities and their lived experiences. Through interactive activities, this experiential workshop seeks to make the students more sensitive and conscious with regards to the phenomenon of disability.

Promotion of a Wholesome Inclusive Education Experience

The intention of the Centre is to create an egalitarian society that appreciates the abilities of persons with disabilities, and willingly provides equal opportunities for all. For this purpose, it strives to profile the students with disabilities in college, identify their specific needs and provide them with customised solutions and support services to maximise their potential.

In August 2021, CDRT in collaboration with Xavier’s Resource Centre for the Visually Challenged (XRCVC), launched Project Shamil, which stands for – Services Harnessing Accessibility Models to Inclusive Learning. This project focuses on a model of the 360-degree approach to inclusion, involving various initiatives for both disabled students and faculty, working towards building an accessible and inclusive environment across the campus.

In September 2021, CDRT in collaboration with Saksham, launched Project Aarohan – an initiative towards creating opportunities for inclusion of students with Blindness and Low Vision in Higher Education. Under this project, assistive devices such as Laptops, Electronic (Refreshable) Braille Display, Daisy Players (digital recorders) and Tablets have been distributed to the visually

impaired undergraduate students of the college. The Centre also provided regular guidance and counselling services to the PwD students as a part of this Project.

The Centre, thus, through various academic and sensitization activities, has laid the foundations of disability awareness and action, in its first year of establishment. The Centre for Disability Research and Training aspires to create an inclusive teaching and learning atmosphere on campus and foster a level-playing field for students with disabilities so that they could realise the fullness of their potential and become significant contributors in India's growth story.

4. Centre for Innovation and Social Enterprise

Centre for Innovation and Social Enterprise 1st Workshop Report (21 September 2021)







4. An Innovative mind: Leadership for entrepreneurship



Social media strategies were leveraged, with creative and attractive Instagram reels and post formations being created under each project to maximize online engagement.

The reels under Project Dor and Project Syahi managed to reach 20K+ people combined. We were able to reflect our originality and quality by featuring in various newspapers, magazines and radio shows.

Interactive online workshops and live sessions were also conducted under different projects, including a composting workshop held on 22 nd April 2021.

Despite the limited opportunities during the pandemic, Enactus Kirori Mal College was able to do engage in ground-level work as well, including finding and training new communities, helping the community members in getting vaccinated and introducing new verticals under the projects.

Owing to the impact we have created, our projects received letters of appreciation from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, the Indian Agricultural Research Institute, Krishi Vigyan Kendra, and other such prestigious authorities.

We also showcased our projects in various competitions and won laurels in the same. Project Syahi was placed second at IIT Madras' Bootcamp and Project Jan Bhoomi was one of the top 48 teams worldwide in Enactus Global's 1 Race 4 Oceans in 2021.

In our latest achievement, Project Syahi made it to the top 48 teams worldwide in the 2022 Race to Rethink Plastic organised by Enactus Global.

To help the members of the organisation receive guidance and mentorship from their seniors, we organised two workshops for

them with our Enactus KMC alumni, Shivam Shukla and Saubhagya Raizada. Shivam, who served as the President of EKMC during 2017-2018, took a session on Careers in the Social Impact Sector on 16th April, 2022. Saubhagya, who served as the Vice President during 2017-2018 took a session on Workflow Management on 22nd April 2022.

Our accomplishments and work successfully reflected our core value of creating impact through entrepreneurial action and empowering underprivileged communities, and we will strive to continue doing so in the future as well.

6. Entrepreneurship Cell

ENEUR: The Entrepreneurship Cell of Kirori Mal College is known for its quirky and out-of-the-box approaches. Brewing with unparalleled creativity and trend-setting ideas, society has been successful in proving its worth for yet another year.

Eneur began its activities for the Academic Session by announcing its core team on the 16th of July. The newly formed core team then initiated its work with the announcement of the first episode of EN-VISION, a live session on "People Development" by the industrial relations head of Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd., Mr. Vinod Singh on 30th August. It was followed by the second episode of the same in which Ms. Prerna Prasad, founder and CEO of Ecoplore, familiarised the students with the prestigious concept of "green entrepreneurship" in another enriching live session on October 2nd. The team began the session's recruiting process on November 23 and picked a group of 46 eager students with an interest in entrepreneurship and a desire to view themselves as budding entrepreneurs in the coming years. The heads of their different departments held sessions to explain their duties and the work to the newly hired junior executives.

2022 started with a big bang for society as it announced two new live projects: VC Stories, a one-stop solution for all entrepreneurial needs, and DU Connect, a social learning space catering to different problems faced by students. The cell also geared up for the preparation of its annual event, "Debut D" Entrepreneurial 2022, under the guidance of Principal, Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan and Convener, Dr Sameer Lama. A series of webinars and workshops were conducted along with a quiz that was conducted on D2C from February 3rd to February 5th to give the participants an insight into the world of business. A skill-enhancing workshop on "Analytical Tools" by professional investment bankers Mr. Vignesh Kamath and Ms. Priyanshi Srivastava marked the commencement of the event. The workshop was followed by an interactive speaker session on "Business Marketing" by MICA Ahmedabad alumnus Ms. Niti Goyal. The second day of the event started with an educational session on "Personal Portfolio Management" by JBIMS alumnus Mr. Amit Sahita, who was followed by the entrepreneur of the year 2022 honouree, Mr. Tushar Kansal, in an enlightening workshop on "How to Create a Pitch Deck". The event had over 60 enthusiastic attendees. 

International Mother Tongue Day Celebration: On 21st February 2022, NSS-KMC created awareness about the international mother tongue day using a small video posted on the official Instagram page.

International Women's Day Awareness: On 8th March 2022, NSS-KMC created awareness about INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY. Women are not just creations but also the creator. They are the ones who make a house a real home. An event in collaboration with the Chemistry Society was organized on the occasion of International Women's Day titled 'Women and Science: The unending journey' on 10th March 2022 with Dr. Pragya Yadav as the eminent speaker. She is a Sr. Scientist, head of the biosafety laboratory, National Institute of Virology, Pune. She delivered a talk on the fight against pandemics, immunogenicity and protective efficacy of vaccine models.

Women Conclave 2022 : Sahas-The Women Empowerment Cell, NSS KMC organized its annual women conclave from 11th March to 13th March 2022. Like every past year, this year's women's

conclave too witnessed 14 strong-minded, independent, and opinionated women sharing their insights, suggestions as well as the important values they learned during their own journey. The aim was one- to inspire every girl from every corner of the country to believe in themselves and to stand for what they feel is right.

Dr Ambedkar Jayanti was celebrated on 14th April 2022 with the volunteers of NSS and the students of Chandrawal by teaching them the lesson and learnings about Dr Ambedkar and his teachings and the importance of this day.

UMANG 2022: The annual sports event organized for the students of Chandrawal on 16th April 2022 under the extension of EOTO conducted various games like cricket, relay races, spoon races etc.

Cleanliness drive: The volunteers of the NSS carried out a cleanliness drive on 23 rd April 2022, herein the premises of the Ashoka Lawn and the sports ground were cleaned by the volunteers.

11. Parivartan - The Gender Forum

Parivartan, the Gender forum of Kirori Mal College had a productive life this academic calendar despite difficulties of online mode. The academic year started with its usual practice of holding Orientation programme for new students of the college in the month of August. The number of participation, despite the online mode was significant. Subsequently, after the Orientation programme, the regular weekly meetings were held in continuance with the existing structure of work of the forum. Apart from the organisational meetings, the weekly discussion meetings also ensured the participation of student members in a more organised manner and enabled the forum to continue creating a safe space to talk about various matters related to gender. Some of the themes of the weekly discussion meetings were a) Love and politics b) Queerness c) Clothes and gender. Most of the discussions around these themes, interesting and personal for the participants, were not only vibrant but also continued into more than one meeting. Students prepared presentations and led the discussions leading to a full and deep exploration and understanding of these issues.

Parivartan also did a screening of the award winning PSBT film "Much Ado about Knotting" (2012), directed by Geetika Narang and Anandana Kapur, 2012. The film is a collection of stories from society, looking at people and families obsessed with marriage, the standards of their choices, traversing the universe of classifieds, matchmaking bureaus and websites. The discussion on the film and the issues dealt within the film were lead by student members with active participation from the teaching members of the committee as well.

A talk by Dr. Sunalini Kumar - 'Gender, City and Spaces' was held in November 2021, in the online mode Dr. Sunalini is an Associate Professor, School of Global Affairs, Ambedkar University, Delhi.

The session explored the themes of gender, violence, urban spaces, feminist urbanism, and the construction of spaces in the city.

After a few months of preparation, Parivartan team released its newszine, "Visangati" in the month of February, wherein a substantial number of students contributed their writings and other graphic narratives on various issues on gender.

As part of Parivartan's long standing annual tradition, 8th of March International Women's Day was celebrated by organising a few events. This year it was "Izhaar", an Open Mic session for students and staff members to share their creative expression through acts, poems, songs, dances and other means and celebrate the history of Women's Day. Students also participated in creating art and write collectively. There were around more than 100 participants throughout the day.

The final event of this annual calendar was the annual fest Nazariya'22 held on 22 and 23 April 2022. There were two talks: a)History of Women's Movement, a lecture delivered by Vani Subramanian, filmmaker, founder - Saheli, feminist organisation and activist. b)Kink and gender: Sexuality, desire and body from a feminist perspective, by Jaya Sharma who is a queer feminist author and activist. She is also the founder member of both Nirantar, a Centre for Gender and Education based in New Delhi as well as co-founder of The Kinky Collective. Apart from that film maker and feminist Paromita Vohra joined us for an online discussion after the screening of her film "Unlimited Girls" (2002), which creatively combines fiction and non-fiction to explore the ambiguities and contradictions in women's lives. Mainly filmed as conversations, it explores the double lives that women are forced to live and how they look at feminism and the label "feminist" itself. Parivartan has a very promising team of faculty and student members and hoping that in the post-lockdown phase, it will be able to get back properly and do its safety surveys etc which suffered in last two years.

12. Peace Club

The initiative of constituting a peace club in KMC with the support of Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan was taken in February 2019. The aim of the Peace club is to promote awareness and learning about peace and conflict resolution. Through fortnightly activities with students, the Peace club seeks to achieve and spread the idea of peace and sustainability.

In the month of September, the Peace Club observed a week-long online celebration “Pax Gaia” with students from across the University of Delhi on the occasion of the International Day for Peace. On September 21, we invited two experts to speak on the theme: 'Peace Building, the Quintessential Role of Military and Economy'. The panel consisted of Dr Sweta Chaman Saxena, a Senior Economist in the International Monetary Fund, Washington, currently serving as Chief of Microeconomic Policy in UNESCAP (Thailand). She held an array of expertise in the area of peace, sustainability, economic rebuilding, she had also served as an Economist in the Bank for International Settlements and as a Professor at the University of Pittsburgh. The second guest speaker was Captain Vijay A Srinivas, who had served in Somalia in the 1990s as a part of UNPKO. We received many guests from across the university and from the IMF. Overall, we welcomed 100 people to the prestigious event. Dr Sweta presented to us her opinion on the theme in a brilliantly curated presentation over 30 minutes. Later, Capt. Srinivas took the event down a nostalgic lane, when he presented the photos of his endeavours in Somalia and concluded that Peace begins with oneself.

On the second day, on September 22, we invited Dr Shambhavi Vedantam Murthy under the theme ‘Symphony with environment and peace’. Dr Shambhavi Vedantam Murthy is an alumna of Kirori Mal College and has served at key positions like Advisor to ECOWAS and the African Union on Refugees and Displacement,

Advisor to UN Agencies in Nigeria, Chair of the South Asian Committee on Refugee Protection. She had discussed the impact of environmental degradation in various aspects of our lives such as human rights, migration, health and the ways by which environmental destruction can be minimised and how refugees should be rehabilitated during the time of environmental crises.

In the month of October, the Peace Club conducted one of its biggest collaborations with GSDS, Ministry of Culture, Government of India, where students from across the university of Delhi participated vivaciously. From 28th September to 15th October, the core team members under the Supervision of Dr Vandana Chaudhary conducted a video campaign to advocate Non-Violence Communication(NVC) which included student videos from across the university on the theme of what NVC means to them.

The event was realized under the supervision of Mr Vedabhyas Kundu, Program Officer of GSDS, and Mr Dipanker Sri Gyan, Director of the GSDS. GSDS is the national memorial for the propagation of Gandhian ideals and non-violent conflict resolution. The functional spectrum of the Samiti ranges from generating awareness on the life and message of Mahatma Gandhi in different sections of the society to the promotion of Gandhian constructive work.

This campaign represented an amalgamation of Kirori Mal College, on the behalf of Delhi University, and the Ministry of Culture to develop non-violent communication in the youth. The core team members of the Club, over a period of 10 days, collected videos of students from different colleges of the University of Delhi elucidating their ideas on the theme of 'what Non-Violent Communication means to me' and combined them to make a holistic film presenting a worldview of peaceful and mindful communication. On 15th October, Peace Club sent the project video to Gandhi Darshan, and both the organizations rendered it visible

to their public on all their social media pages. GSDS went on to elaborate upon this idea and this campaign was spread all over the colleges and institutions of India.

The Peace Club organized a Webinar on November 12, 2021, based on the theme 'Blocks of Healthy Future Entangled with Healthy Childhood' with Ms Anupama Muhuri, National lead of Volunteer Action CRY as chief guest. Ms. Muhuri shared her experience from her journey of protecting and fighting for the rights of children. The major aspects covered during this discussion were the role played by quality education, the importance of health and mental well-being in the holistic development of children and the role played by government programmes in providing secured life to children. With her words, she portrayed and reflected the bitter reality of society highlighting the vicious circle of poverty as an obstacle in the holistic development of a child. She presented several real-life examples of people who were provided with financial and educational support becoming role models for their community.

Through her magical words and stories, she got successful in knocking the young mind to delve into the realities of society and imagine the ways of making it a place for the development of all. This event turned out to be a successful and life teaching one with the active participation of an enthusiastic audience.

In January 2022 The Peace Club KMC organised an exceptional online exhibition titled 'The Seeds of Hope And Action' (SOHA). The main theme of this Exhibition was Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with the motto of Making SDGs a Reality. The Exhibition was very unique and new. The Peace Club KMC collaborated with the Bharat Sokka Gakkai (BSG). Bharat Sokka Gakkai is an organisation that focuses on Peace, Human Rights and Sustainable Education.

This KMC SOHA Exhibition was one of the greatest achievements of Peace Club KMC so far. It was yet another initiative taken up by

Peace Club KMC, after the Pax Gaia Week, which aimed towards transforming the young minds of KMC at a college level to become Champions of Peace.

The exhibition focused on the theme “IT STARTS WITH ONE”. It was based on the formula of - *INSPIRE - LEARN - REFLECT - EMPOWER - ACT - LEAD*.

Board of Panelists- KMC students and the Members of BSG gave an insightful presentation on the theme of 'SEEDS OF HOPE AND ACTION'.

The presentation focused on how SDGs can become a reality and how we as an individual do the same. It highlighted upon The Interconnectedness of Life, Global Crises, Threat to Survival, Climate Justice, Human Element, SDGs, Changing of Hearts, Earth Charter, The Power of One, Case Studies and several Real Life Stories.

13. Prayas - The Enabling Unit

The commencement of the 2021-22 session of PRAYAS – The Enabling Unit of our college took place in the August of 2021. Amidst the COVID-19 Pandemic, the session has continued completely on virtual platforms.

The Coordinating Team was recruited by the end of the month. All the members of the coordinating team were chosen on the discretion of their past dedication and work towards the Unit and an interview where the Convener for the club, Dr. Shobha Kaur along with Dr. Ajeet Jha conducted a diversified one-on-one personality test for the applicants.

In all a team of 9 Volunteers: Devashish Barua, Esha, Himanshu Kumar Jha, Ishan Jain, Manya Jain, Parul Verma, Saurav Sauhta, Shilpi Dubey, and Yashasvi Suman and Zunaid, was made and divided into respective teams of Social Media Handling, Content, Graphics and Technical and Event Management Team. A Record Management Team and Reading, Writing and Recording Team was also brought into Act under the Coordinating Team.

Soon after the selection of head Coordinators, recruitment for new volunteers was issued and by mid-September, about 61 new volunteers were recruited. The Enabling Unit consists of about more than 85 PwD Students belonging to different departments, from graduation as well as post-graduation level.

With a successful recruitment drive the session took high-spirited beginning with the first Group Body Meeting (G.B.M.) on 21st September, 2021. This marked the first informal interaction PRAYAS with its new family. Here, the students were also asked to share about there different experiences and specialized sectors of work in order to get into the department of their choices.





EVENT 1- Panel Discussion On The Theme “Re-appraisal Of The 2030 Agenda For Sustainable Development”

The forum took its first step in organizing a webinar on the theme “Re-appraisal of the 2030 agenda for sustainable development” on 29 October 2021.


With only a decade left to implement the SDGs the panel discussion was a medium to stimulate the critical assessment of these goals to trace the trajectory (the past, present and future) of the 17 sustainable development goals. The event was graced by eminent panelists- Dr. Yeshwanth sonnathi who is a medical doctor, researcher, an SDG advocate, and an aspiring global health leader with professional volunteering experience and Ms. Devahuti Choudhary who is an SDG Impact Specialist for the Asia-Pacific region at UNDP.



EVENT 2- Webinar on the theme “Significance of Youth Engagement in Public Policy”

On 30th november 2021, the second session of YLPDF was organized with panelists Prof. Madhulika Banerjee, Ms. Pankhuri Jain, and Mr. Vardaan Shekhawat and our Principal Ma'am Prof. Vibha Singh Chauhan, on the topic “Significance of Youth Engagement in Public Policy”. Prof. Banerjee opined that student-run initiatives to discuss policy is in itself a challenge to the hierarchy of old politicians and bureaucrats deciding welfare of the masses, a challenge that must be appreciated.

She remarked “Getting education is itself a privilege one gets by accident of birth and then they exercise that privilege to make decisions for the unprivileged - this is problematic”.



Event 3 - Group discussion on the theme “Impact of Increased OTT Services During Lockdown”

On 18th January 2022, YLPDF organized its first group discussion session, on the topic “Impact of Increased OTT Services during the Lockdown”. The participants touched on various aspects of the topic ranging from its need during lockdown to censorship, from its impact on health to its impact on the nation's youth, from globalization due to OTT to evolving job opportunities in the field.

EVENT 4- “Vijaya Campaign”

In the month of March, 2022, we initiated a social media campaign called: “विजया – प्रयास. परिर्तन. प्रगवर्” herein for each follow we get on our Instagram handle, we educated one girl/woman about the various legal, financial and social policies, fundamental rights and government schemes that are beneficial to them. We collaborated with “Shanti Sahyog” NGO and successfully educated 300 young girls and women. Apart from this, we also conducted separate sessions for the Domestic Violence Victims to make them aware of the judicial proceedings to seek justice in such cases and shared resource guides with them for future references.



EVENT 5- Group Discussion on the theme “Uniform Civil Code”

A group discussion was organized by YLPDF on the topic: "Uniform Civil Code in India- the final stage of its formulation?" on 19th April. The offline event saw active participation from students across various departments and years.

The discussion began with students giving their opening remarks on what is the Uniform Civil Code, its constitutionality, what all areas it covers, its history and what is its status in contemporary India.
