ADVENTURE CLUB - THE ESCAPADE CELL

The Adventure Club got reactivated in 2018 where three meetings were conducted with staff advisors and students. Enthusiasm of the students and faculty members motivated the members to reactivate the club and give a chance to the students to showcase their adventurous skills. In the meeting, it was decided to conduct adventure motivation talks by experts. Despite resource constraints, the adventure team together performed following activities successfully.

In January and February, the Club organized a number of activities with great exertion. On 22nd February 2019, Adventure Club organized a prize distribution function with Mrs. Reena Kaushal Dharamshaktu as the Chief Guest. Mrs. Dharamshaktu is the first Indian woman to sky from South Pole to Antarctica. Members were excited to meet her when she shared her experiences of 29 December 2009, when she made the historic ski-run as part of an eight-woman Commonwealth team (The Kaspersky Commonwealth Antarctic Expedition), which crossed a 900 kilometer Antarctic ice trek to reach the South Pole, marking 60th anniversary of the founding of the Commonwealth. Students of various colleges showcased presentations of their adventure trips and explained them with their experiences.

AMCatKMC-THE ANNUAL MAGAZINE COMMITTEE

After putting the indelible mark on 26th April of the Annual Day Prize Distribution Ceremony 2018 by releasing the 64th edition of the Annual Magazine for the first time in the history of the College, the current session began with the entrance exam on 7th August 2018 for the selection of excellent student editors in the Student Editorial Board. It was an initiative taken by the Chief Editor of the Magazine, Dr. Praveen Kumar Anshuman. The concept was introduced to form the best team of editors for the 65th edition of the Annual Magazine and onwards. The selected students were acquainted with the structure and working of the Committee through an Orientation Ceremony organized on 14th August 2018.

Thereafter, several meetings of the Committee were held regularly, the result of which is an edition of the magazine that has proved to better than every other editions in the past. Apart from drafting and editing of the magazine, the Committee also organized its first event, MERAKI- A Creative Aura on the International Girl Child Day i.e. 11th October 2018. The event celebrated creativity and art by holding two events, An Open Mic and The Conjectured Tales, which saw active participation from students across Delhi University. Prof. Nandini Sahu, a renowned poet, and Dr. Ajay Navaria, a famous writer on Dalit Studies, graced the event as the Chief Guest and the Guest of Honour respectively. The event, which was dedicated to the 76th birthday of luminous alumnus Shri Amitabh Bachchan, who expressed his happiness on the programme and intimated the College about the same on his letter head, proved to be a great success. The Committee crossed a major milestone in its journey when it was introduced to the College by a new name, AMCatKMC, given by the Convenor of the Committee. On 3rd November 2018, it also inaugurated its Bulletin Board, which, due to its innovative and creative updates regularly done by the student editors, remain a board or a centre of attraction for the entire student community of the College

The Committee also organized the first edition of its Annual Fest, RASO VAI SAH: The Editors' Extravaganza on 12th-13th March 2019. A team of fifty volunteers was hired through a rigorous selection process to organize the first ever fest of the Committee. 'Voice of Spring: An Open Mic Competition' was organized on 16th February 2019 as preliminary round to 'Eunoia', the winners of which were given direct entry into its final round. The event was judged by Dr. Satya Prakash Prashad (Assistant Professor, JMI) and Dr. Sandesha Rayapa (Assistant Professor, JNU).

The first day of the Fest began with 'Euonia: Open Mic' in which Dr. Ram Prakash Dwivedi (Associate Professor, University of Delhi) and Dr. Vishali Sharma (Assistant Professor, Sharda University) were invited as the Judges. It was followed by the Inauguration Ceremony in the presence of the Principal and the Convener, along with the Chief Guest Ms. Nasera Sharma and the Guest of Honour, Shri Atul Kothari. The ceremony commenced with the lamp lighting ceremony by the teachers and the guests, followed by the welcome note of the Principal and introductory remark by the Convener. The guests then cut the ribbon of the Fest's Shield, made by Abhishek Makol, graphic editor of the Committee with the Convener. The session concluded with the valuable words of both the guests. The last event of the day was 'The Editors' Conclave', an initiative by the Committee to acknowledge and appreciate the work of the editors across all disciplines and genres. This one-of-a-kind-step for the editors' community proved to be successful when guests like Shri Prabhash Kumar Jha (Editor, NBT Online), Shri Anurag Punetha (Anchor, LSTV) and Shri Harsh Vardhan Tripathi (Renowned Blogger and TV Panelist) graced the event. The session was presided by Shri Anant Vijay (Associate Editor, Dainik Jagaran).

The last day of the Fest was full of student oriented activities. Seven major events, apart from various side events, were organized in different parts of the College. Dr. Kumar Anand Gautam (Assistant Professor, Sharda University) and Dr. Anuradha Gupta (Assistant Professor, University of Delhi) were invited to judge the event 'Eloquivaganza: Turn Quote Debate'. Other events like 'Meme-e-fied', 'Apocalypse', 'Murder Mystery', 'Agog', 'Twisting the Tale', and 'Marvelously Marvel' were also organized smoothly and saw participation from almost all the colleges of the University. The winners of all the events were felicitated in the Valedictory Ceremony by the Chief Guest, Shri Vidya Nath Jha (Anchor, News Nation) and the Guest of Honour, Dr. Kumar Vimlendu Singh (The Renowned Poet and Scholar). This final section of the Fest was concluded with the vote of thanks by the Convener.

To mark the end of this eventful session, the Committee organized 'Ataraxia: The Flux within You', a stress free session, for its volunteers and members on 30th March 2019 in which student from other colleges too participated. Dr. Pushpa Goel (Ma Jeevan Sarita) from Osho International Resort, Pune, graced the event. The session proved to be very beneficial for the students. It was followed by the Felicitation Ceremony wherein all the volunteers and editors were acknowledged for their contribution in the successful organization of the Fest. 10 Best Volunteers were also chosen based on their performance and dedication and LORs were given to those who portrayed sincerity towards their work. Tour De Zine, the Annual Tour of the Committee, was also organized on the same day, wherein the team went on a day long excursion to Purana Quila.

All in all, it was the most successful session for the Committee since its inception.

The current academic year marked another exceptionally successful session for Avenues - The Placement Cell of the College. With students being placed across various roles of their choice, this perpetual success can be associated with the continuous support by the esteemed faculty members who led to a fruitful placement drives.


During the session, The Cell was associated with the corporate giants like Ernst & Young, PWC, Deloitte, S&P Global, D.E. Shaw, I.D. Insight, Byju's, B.C.G., McKinsey & Co., etc thereby providing the graduating batch with exceptional placement opportunities, which gave them a chance to choose from diverse profiles complemented by rewarding pay packages. A total of 400 students registered for the placement session from multiple backgrounds including Mathematics, English, Statistics, Science, Economics and Commerce.

The confidence of the leading organizations in the exceptional capabilities of the students of the College was evinced in the placement session which saw seventy four companies offering an average of INR 5.57 LPA. Over fifty students got placed with the average CTC accepted being INR 4.74 LPA. The Highest package was valued at INR 20.5 LPA.

Stream Wise Students Placed:





Average CTC:



The average accepted CTC was valued at INR 4.74 LPA. The highest package offered was valued at INR 20.5 LPA. The Cell witnessed another remarkable year with companies rolling out offers crossing a gross worth more than INR 3,56,00,000.




Professional Profiles:


During this time, the number of fellowship profiles offered was attested by renowned recruiters like Yes Foundation, Transforming India and Teach for India. Out of the specified companies, the highest stipend offered for Articleship profile was offered by AARK. The highest stipend offered for fellowship profile was by Teach for India.



Comparative Statistics (For the session 2017-18 and 2018-19):

Over the past session, the Cell has been successful in gradually and steadily improving the placement statistics in the form of an increase in both accepted and offered CTC.

- The Highest CTC offered in 2018-19 was INR 20.5 LPA which was 7.89% more than the highest CTC in 2017-18, INR 19 LPA.
- 2. The average CTC of the top 20 companies in 2018-19 was 8.79 LPA as compared to 7 LPA in 2017-18.
- In terms of average CTC offered, session 2018-19 witnessed an increase from 4.6 LPA in 2017-18 to 5.57 LPA.



ECO-CLUB: BHOOMI - THE ENVIRONMENTAL SOCIETY

Bhoomi, the Eco Club Society of the College, is one of the distinctive Societies that aims at making students understand the importance of the eco system. The history of the Society defines the procurement of its members and the campus remains vibrant through various multi-dimensional activities and awareness campaigns the Society keeps organizing. Its motto is to make the campus healthier and cleaner, and students more aware.

It organized its Orientation Programme for the new volunteers to introduce them to their responsibilities and duties. A workshop on 'Measures at Construction Sites to Control Air Pollution' was also held. It organized a talk on 'Diarrheal Disease' wherein the methods of prevention from diarrhea were discussed. Similarly, a talk on 'Adulteration in Sweets during Festival Seasons' was also conducted. 'KMC - Swachh Survey' was conducted to initiate steps towards a cleaner campus. An online Holi campaign was organized to spread awareness about the conservation of water by promoting limited use of water during the celebration. Members of the Society also visited the sewage treatment plant of Delhi Jal Board.

ENACTUS KMC - THE ENTREPRENEUR WING

Enactus began the new academic year with the induction of fifty-five new members into the team. The recruits were vigorously trained for fitting into their respective departments by conducting numerous workshops. The team has been working on three projects – "Dor", "Patradya" and "JanBhoomi" while simultaneously researching on a new project.

Under Project Patradya, the team successfully launched new forms of edible cutlery - spoons and plates - in different flavours - chocolate, coffee, savoury and achari.

Project Dor, with great success, introduced a new collection of Chanderi dupattas and cushion covers. Project Dor can now be seen in Vishnu Store in Khan Market, and on Amazon India and US.

The newest project, JanBhoomi, was able to get into a collaboration with the Government of Haryana under the second Super Village Challenge, opening over eighty-five pits of compost in seventy villages in Haryana.

Given the diverse range of products, the team collaborated with various reputed organizations this year including IARI, the Pinkishe Foundation, Vaaya, and different cafes and boutiques across Delhi NCR.

Amidst all this, Enactus KMC organized an "Entrepreneurship Development Program", and a fundraising campaign, under which it was able to reach its target of two lac rupees in less than thirty days.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL-THE EGALITERIAN CELL

Keeping in mind the need to create a more just society for marginalized sections, the College set up an Equal Opportunity Cell in 2016. The need for such a cell at this level comes from the understanding that higher education is a tool for attaining social and economic equality. The Cell, thus, aims to address the issue of access and equality while ensuring the standard of quality and relevance of education by implementing policies of the Government of India and promoting several schemes and programmes for the disadvantaged groups. The primary objective of the Cell is to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programmes for such groups in order to provide guidance and counselling with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters. Students (either individually or in a group) can freely approach the Cell to seek resolution of their problems and grievances.

The range of activities includes sensitization programmes, English language proficiency programmes, remedial classes, interactive sessions and other academic related activities. An interactive session was organized in the month of February 2019. Two more seminars were organized in the month of March and April 2019 and ensured giving wings to future endeavours of disadvantaged groups.

Another interactive seminar in this series was organized on 23rd August 2018 with Retd. Major General Dr. P. K. Sehgal in College on the topic "Family of Martyrs & their condition in the society". The talk was outlined with some comments on the state of families of martyrs.

Overall, it was a healthy discussion with the students, and much needed talk on this unattended topic.

FIC-THE FINANCE AND INVESTMENT CELL

The academic session proved to be a major milestone for the Finance and Investment Cell. After the recruitment process, the FIC family of fifty members held its orientation session that not just marked the beginning of an amazing journey but also proved to be crucial for the basic understanding of what each member is expected to deliver.

FIC organized a visit on 4th September 2018 to the prestigious Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) office. It also organized a one day seminar on 11th September 2018 in collaboration with SEBI and NSE and in association with knowledge partner HDFC Mutual funds on "Financial Inclusion through Financial Education."

The Cell organized a seminar on "Anticipating & Building Skills for Future Jobs" on 3rd October 2018. Prof. Muneesh Kumar, Head, Department of Financial Studies along with Dr. Dietrich Kebschull, Chairman, Indo-German Export Promotion Program (IGEP) were the speakers for the session.

FIC also organized a National Seminar on "Emerging Issues in Global Business Research and Management Practices" in collaboration with COMSOC, the Commerce Society, in November 2018. Apart from such sessions and seminars that gave students the opportunities to learn, the office bearers conducted regular presentations in order to enhance students' financial knowledge.

The Cell organized MULYA'19, a two day Annual Fest, on 11th and 12th February 2019. The Fest comprised speaker session by eminent Dr. Charan Singh (Non-Executive Chairman of PSB), Prof. Sanjay Bakshi (Adjunct Prof. at MDI), Dr. Vijay Kedia (Owner of Kedia Securities Pvt. Ltd.) and Ashish Kalra (Founder of IGP Institute) along with plethora of events. The Fest was a huge success with participation of over 200 students from all over the University.

Thus, in a nutshell, the session was a major turning point for the Cell.

FOSTAS - THE FOREIGN STUDENTS ASSOCIATION

FOSTAS, the Foreign Students Association, is an official part of the College. It was instituted with a view to promote friendly relations and cultural exchanges among international students.

The Association began its session with Freshers' Party in August 2018 to welcome all the foreign students admitted to the College. It also organized two trips, a five day long trip to Gujarat in the month of October and an overnight trip in March. On 11th February 2019, FOSTAS organized a friendly football match among International Hostel students, Tibetan Hostel Students and its own members. Recently, it also organized its Annual Fest, MELANGE, in which Dr. Shyama Rath, Dean, FSR, was invited as the Chief Guest. Dr. Lobsang Yangtso, a JNU Scholar, and Ms. Azka Khan, the Founder President of Global Conflux of Stalwarts and Director of Board at Global Peace Initiatives, graced the event as the Guest Speakers for International Conference on "Developing Countries and Sustainable Development". It was followed by cultural performances by students from different nations. The event ended with a Farewell Party for the graduating members who received certificates, shirts and mementos as a token of appreciation.

With the motto of "Each One, Teach One", Sahyog, the children empowerment unit of the Society, aims at empowering and educating the underprivileged children of nearby slum area Chandrawal, the adopted village of NSS, KMC. Children are not only given quality education but are also provided lessons for overall personality development. Beside daily session of teaching, fun events for children are also organized regularly.

On 14th August 2018, the students and volunteers celebrated the 72nd Independence Day. The students were told about the importance of 15th August as Indian citizens and some of the students shared their thoughts on the same. It was concluded with a speech by the Principal and the programme officer, Dr. Benu Gupta. On 21st August 2018, the students celebrated the festival of Eid-al-Adha or Bakrid. Programme Officer explained the purpose behind Bakrid and gave an account of it as narrated in the Qur'an. On 25th August, the students celebrated this beautiful picture by tying rakhis on the wrists of the volunteers. A few students recited poems and stories that they knew about rakhi. One of the volunteer informed the students about the various legends that are behind 'rakshabandhan'. The Programme Officer addressed the gathering and told about the significance of the festival. SAHAS - THE WOMEN EMPOWERMENT UNIT

The Unit strives to improve and escalate political, social, economic and legal strength of women. It had the privilege to invite eminent personalities including various police officers, musicians like Shibani Kashyap, politicians like Ma'am Shelia Dikshit and many more, for the first ever Women Conclave organized under the banner of Delhi University. Basic Commodities Collection Drive was organized on 20th-23rd August 2018 in the wake of unprecedented floods of Kerala, in which students and the staff members made a generous contribution of basic elementary materials. A Movie Screening of "The Story of A Young Bride" was also organized in collaboration with Parivartan-The Gender Forum of the College on 14th September. It was followed by an interactive discussion over the issue of menstruation.

A three week online campaign was initiated on 24th September 2018 on the theme 'Breaking the Chains'. It was carried out on all the social platforms and online spaces used by the members. It was aculmination of issues pertaining to gender equality, women empowerment & recent amendments like Section 377 and Section 497 in the Indian Constitution. Through this, the veracity of several myths and doubts centering on women empowerment and notions of gender were questioned.

An interactive session was organized on the topic, 'Verdict on Adultery' after the withdrawal of the Adultery Law under Section 497 by Supreme Court on 27th September 2018. Various opinions and interpretations were put forth regarding the new judgment directing towards the fact that women shall not be treated as a commodity.

The Unit also hosted an interactive seminar on 'Stress Management' with Dr. Nitin Saraswat, Founder at Moulding Thoughts, on 3rd October 2018. The speaker interacted with the audience and tried to burst the myths surrounding the issue and its overuse in present narrative. Another session on "Team Building" highlighted some of the most significant things like what is a team and how it can be effectively built along with the lesson to first build a team with one's own self.

SUPATH, the Annual Festival of the Unit, was hosted from 27th-30th October 2018. The first phase of the Fest began with 'Happy Feet' on 27th October, the first ever marathon organized by the Scheme. The last phase PAHAL' 18, the Annual Girls' Athletic Meet of the College was hosted on 30th October. The day was filled with vigour and excitement and amidst the thrills, shrills and cheers when the female participants were enthusiastically encouraged.

'Ab Samjhauta Nahin', an educative workshop on Sexual Harassment and Rights, was conducted on 16th January in collaboration with Josh talks & ITC Vivel. The session comprised talks and discussions on Sexual Harassment, Consent, Cyber Bullying and Safety. It also shed light on expanding the definition of 'gender'. INFRASTRUCTURAL AND INSTITUTIONAL COMMITTEES

THE GARDEN COMMITTEE

Considering the plethora of benefits that flora showers upon us, the Garden Committee of the College, under the guidance of Convenor Dr. Sunil Kumar Dhiman, worked strenuously to bring about major significant changes within the college premises. The Committee organized a plantation drive on the 1st April 2018 in which certain species of Ficus along with chrysanthemum were planted. Flower beds were laid around the peripheral parts of Ashok Lawn bordering it from within. The flower beds were mainly associated with the growth of Dahlia, species of Ranunculus, Coreopsis, Zinnia, Pansies that laid across, Among the most significant tasks that was successfully accomplished was the bedding and maintenance of herbal garden, which comprised plants like Hibiscus, Aloe, Basil, Tylophora, Geranium and many more. The Committee also worked intensely and dedicatedly to renovate and reinvigorate the teacher's lawn of the College by planting and bolstering it with several species of flowers as well as plants like chrysanthemum, Dahlia, marigold, certain species of peonies and a number of herbs and plants. The Ashok Lawn was also flanked by installing the nets around the borders of it by the Committee itself under the cautious factions of the Convener to provide appropriate light and to limit the actions of pests rendering around the plants. The Committee undertook the major and significant step towards coping up with the increasing level of pollution by planting several small to medium plants around tress in the parking area of the College, that provide the campus with a more green and sustainable entourage.

THE GYM COMMITTEE

THE LIBRARY COMMITTEE

The N. S. Pradhan Memorial Library is one of the most extensive libraries of the University of Delhi. It caters not only to the college's academic requirements, but also stocks leisure books and books of general awareness. It is fully computerized, houses about 1.5 lac books and can accommodate about 350 students. The Library Committee plays an effective and important role to run the library efficiently. The Committee subscribes to 52 journals in different subjects, 30 Periodicals / Magazines of general taste and 16 Newspapers. Internet facility is available for students and teachers in the Portal Room. A reference section with a very good collection is situated at the first floor of the consultation. As an initiative by the Committee, a new computer room for blind students at the ground floor with latest version of JAWS has been provided. Oxford Dictionary for visually handicapped students has been purchased. There is an ever collection of 81 books in Braille, 22 tape records, 100 audiocassettes and 25 I Pods for visually handicapped students. The Library Committee of College also subscribes magazines for visually handicapped students.
