The Eco-Club is a platform in the College where we get the knowledge about environment. The meaning of 'Eco-Club' is a group of members who works to contribute for improving the environmental conditions of the Institution. Its activities include organizing seminars, debates, lectures and popular talks on environmental issues in the College. Students are encouraged to campaign against banned carry bags, use of loud speakers, banned fire-works, recycling of glass and metals, filling of water body in the adjacent area, and use of unnecessary horns. The program may further include field visit to environmentally important sites including polluted and degraded sites, wildlife parks, etc. Organising rallies, marches, human chains and street theatre at public places with a view to spread environmental awareness may be done regularly. Many action based activities like tree plantation, cleanliness drives both within and without can be added to the list. Students should be encouraged to do innovative programme on environmental issues.

'Eco-Club' plays an important role in creating environmental awareness for the future generation. Department of Environment provides increased token grant of twenty thousand rupees to each 'Eco-Club' of the college for undertaking various eco-friendly activities.

Achievements of the Society till Date

- Poster Making Competition on Anti-Cracker Drive 'Pollution-An Evil' was done.
- Plantation drive was done on 30th September, 2016 in collaboration with LFT Society (Leaders for Tomorrow) in Herbal Garden and Ashoka Lawn of the College.
- All the student members of 'Eco-Club' took part in the drive enthusiastically to make the event successful.
- On 8th October, 2016 a Cleanliness Drive was held to clean the backside of the Chemistry Department.
- An Anti- cracker Campaign was organized on 28th October 2016 followed by a Poster making competition on 'Say No to Crackers'. This event of 'Eco-Club' focused on spreading the message of celebrating an anti-cracker and pollution free Diwali. Members of eco club society spread awareness among students and faculty members about the hazardous impacts of crackers on the health of people. All were requested not to burn crackers on Diwali.
- A Rally on cruelty on animals and poster making competition depicting the
 atrocities done to animals was held on 10th February, 2017. Students and
 members of 'Eco-Club' took out a peaceful walk apprising the students about
 the cruelty meted out to animals. Through that rally, we requested people 'Not
 to be cruel to animals', and we also appealed to all of them to love and protect
 them. There was a poster making competition where prizes were given to the
 poster which depicted the theme most explicitly creative. Students participated
 in that poster-making competition with a great zeal.
- A Seminar on 'Respiratory Allergy and Applied Immunology' was held on 6th March, 2017 by Prof. Raj Kumar, Head, NCRAAI and DRAAI Patel Chest. Mr. Shree Ram Oberoi was the Guest of Honour. Prof. Raj Kumar gave a lucid talk on respiratory diseases and the allergies caused due to the indoor and outdoor pollution. It was a very interesting and interactive session.
- An online and offline survey was done by the members of 'Eco-Club' to
 understand how everyone was celebrating Holi, whether it was without water,
 using herbal colours or with the normal toxic colours, or indiscriminately
 wasting water. Around twenty five volunteers of 'Eco-Club' society again walked
 around the college corridors and interacted with students and faculty members
 to restrain and play a toxic free Holi.
- Around thirty eight volunteers enthusiastically attended the 'Walkathon—Walk for Water' that was a walk from India Gate to Man Singh Road crossing. The multiple events included slogans, jingles, water pledge followed by National anthem and vote of thanks.

- The annual Festival 'Bhoomi' was organized on 28th March, 2017. The day started with a plantation drive where four trees were planted by the volunteers of 'Eco-Club' under the guidance of Dr. Bhuvan. The Principal and the Staff planted many species of rare, important medicinal plants and forest trees. The species of medicinal plants include species such as Chitrak (Plumbagozeylanica), Vajradanti (Barleriaprinoites), Zhinti (Barleriacristata), Babchi (Psoraleacorylifolia) among others. Among forest species, rare species such as Bijasal (Pterocarpusmarsupium), Rohida (Tecomellaundulata), Kala Sheesham (Dalbergialatifolia), Khejdi (Prosopis cineraria) etc. were plantedto enrich the flora of the College. Students and teachers participated in the event with great enthusiasm. They were told about the medicinal importance of these plants.
- Ms. Anumita Chowdhary was the Chief Guest, Executive Director, Centre for Science and Environment - Research and Advocacy. She enlightened the audience with the effects of air pollution and clean transportation programme, campaigns for clean air and public health, and how the policy makers should alter their plan to optimize geographic space for reducing pollution and making compact smart cities. The Annual Festival of 'Eco-Club' of the College namely BHOOMI 2017 was conducted on 28th March, 2017. Many activities were conducted like essay writing competition, slogan writing competion, plantation drive, speaker session etc.
- The topic selected for slogan writing was 'Ban on Manual Scavenging', a very
 relevant topic with context to 'Swach Bharat Abhiyan'. Manual Scavenging is a
 term used for the removal of untreated human excreta from toilets manually.
 The persons involved in this type of work are called manual scavengers.
 Employing manual scavengers to empty toilets were prohibited in India in 1993.
 The students came up with very good ideas and Slogans providing a strong
 message in this regard.
- The staff members were felicitated for their active participation in the activities
 of the Society throughout the year. The co-ordinators were given mementos and
 certificates too. All the volunteers were thanked for their active participations
 round the year. Nikhil Aggarwal was given the memento for being the 'Best
 Volunteer' as he was instrumental in ensuring the participation of students in

Every year, 8th March, 2017, is celebrated as 'International Women's Day'. It was 8th March, 2014, the day when SAHAS: The Women Empowerment Cell of the College took its inception. This year it has celebrated three glorious. First time on 8th March 'SAHAS Foundation Day' was celebrated. We were honoured to have our Principal, Dr. Dinesh Khattar, as a part of our celebration. We kicked-off the event with a video

Garden Committee

With several developmental programmes at hand, the Garden Committee continued to remain very active throughout the academic year 2016-2017. In view of a long standing demand for saving the delicate plants from the blistering heat of Delhi, a net-shelter-cum-green-house for plants was fully fabricated in the College plant nursery during May and June of 2016. This green house is now shelter home to more than 500 plant pots bearing the delicate money plants, crotons, Dieffenbachias, ferns, Bignonias etc.

At the beginning of this semester, the library lawn was decorated with bright red, horizontal (boat shaped) flowering pots bearing about 30 different varieties of evergreen, short statured plants. When viewed from the seminar room nursery side, the whole library border looks colourful and lively as never before. Interestingly, this collection of succulents, perennials and herbs is also useful for the plant identification in plant taxonomy studies of the students.

Plantation in Ashoka Lawn, Herbal Lawn and Plant Nursery continued vigorously during the months of August and September, 2016. Different varieties of Ixora, Ficus, Syngonias and Araucarias were transplanted, together with about three hundred saplings of guldaudis (Chrysanthemums). Meanwhile, attractive seasonal plants of Kochia, Zinnia and Portulacas continued to beautify the College Front (near the entrance). The bright yellow giant blooms of the sunflower (hybrid varieties) rendered picturesque beauty to the foreground of main building. It is proud to say that we had these huge sunflowers for the first time in Campus.

As planned, the upscaling of whole garden lawn was promptly taken up in the early part of October. Lots of plants of Furcarias, grass-varieties (like the Ribbon Grass, Kota Grass, Lemon Grass) and the ferns were brought for garden improvement from Gulabi Bagh nurseries. Numerous decorative plants were transplanted also in the Photocopy Lawns. Poinsettias (bright red) were spread all over and the bright hues of Ashoka Lawn flower beds made the College campus vibrant and colourful. We also brought exclusive varieties of money plants (in baskets), Lucky Bamboos, Asparagus etc. to enrich the Campus flora. In addition, yellow fragrant double Tagetes, marigold and cock's comb (red and velvety variety), Areca palms, Spammery etc. were planted/ displayed by the 23rd October in corridor, staff room, and various departments fetch quite appreciation by the students and the faculties.

Principal's bungalow has also been now updated with consistent efforts of mali-s and staff alike. Winter flowering plants were continually transferred to the College gardens

by the beginning of November including varieties of Chrysanthemums (guldaudis), double Dahlias, Phlox, Verbena and Pansies, which came into profound bloom with the herald of winter in the month of December and January. It made the Campus look like the famed Lodhi's Garden of New Delhi (known for raising a very large number of Chrysanthemum (guldaudis) varieties.

For this year's Founder's Day (First February), a mega event of—selected plants from Raj nursery (Punjabi Bagh) and the other local sellers with—the Vice Chancellor as the Chief Guest was specially procured for the purpose in satisfactory numbers. Since the flowering season had not begun its momentum, a lot of field-works, market-surveys and bookings were made for the timely decoration of the College campus. These assignments were successfully completed and we had put up an attractive display of Dahlias, marigold/Tagetes, Adeniums, Syngonium, stocks, Petunias (variegated varieties), Knolina and Areca palms throughout the College and the New Auditorium.

Over a fortnight after the College Founder's Day, our nursery is now flush with flowers like Salvias, Kalanchoes, Alyssum, Cineraria, Calendula and Kales. Throughout the month of March, the bright red Salvias, as also Dahlias and Petunias bloomed copiously in Ashoka Lawns, as if a splash of colours in the month of Holi festivities; much like the fabulous nature playing the Holi colours. I must thank our students of B. Sc. (Honours) Botany in the College, particularly Diksha Sindhwani, Kirti Jain, Surinder Singh, Prince Saif, Mansi Bansal, Riya Dahiya, Sweety, Nisha Garg and Sucheta Vashishtha, for their whole-hearted co-operation in the Plant Census and naming of the trees in the College campus.

For the knowledge-sharing, members of the Garden Committee (namely Dr. Pratibha, Dr. Vandana, Dr. Harish, Dr. Rashmi, Dr. Kiran, Dr. Preeti, Dr. Rajni and myself) visited the Mughal Gardens, the Garden of Five Senses and the PUSA Krishi Mela in February to March, 2017. The project of raising the Iron Railings in the Ashoka Lawn has begun and may be completed before the Annual Day of the College.

As our nursery is entirely fenced and secured with high-level barbed wiring, we can have home-set seeds and saplings for the next academic year. Besides, a comprehensive pruning/ sizing of trees is being undertaken as we have obtained permission from the Government Forest Department (at Kamla Nagar Ridge). This will assist in clearing dry shoots and over-grown branches which will beautify our College campus further.

We have spared no efforts and time to complete the above projects as much as possible. We are grateful to our garden staff like (Messers Ram Lakhan, Ved Prakash, Ghisin Ram, Dhruv, John, Nanhe, Ram Pal, Gajraj and Vinod for their hard work and consistent efforts in this regard.
