


FIG. 3.2. RESEARCH GRANT SANCTIONED TO DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS IN KIRORI MAL COLLEGE




Fig 3.2. RESEARCH GRANT SANCTIONED TO KIRORI MAL COLLEGE IN DIFFERENT INNOVATION PROJECTS

Discussions on Gendered and Sexual Violence largely triggered by the <i>Nirbhaya</i> case.
Series of workshop/presentation and discussion on Love and Technology . It tried to understand the ways in which the youth relate with technology in their day to day lives and how this defines their inter-personal relationships.
Screening of film "Devi" and discussion on issues of gender arising out of the film
Screening of film "Khamosh Pani", followed by a discussion
A programme titled ' Gender Right ', which was organized to honour our colleague Dr. Asha Mittal who recently retired and also to particularly acknowledge and celebrate her struggle for gender-rights.
Parivartan held a programme of silence for <i>Nirbhaya</i> in January - a large group of students and teacher gathered in the Library quadrangle and observed two minutes silence in memory of <i>Nirbhaya</i> , exactly a month after she was brutalized. A pledge was also read out, a pledge that we would stand up against all forms of sexual violence, make the university a safe area and demand safety as a right and not as privilege.
Screening of Rahul Roy's film "Majma" as part of the masculinity workshop.
Parivartan was also present at the launch of One Billion Rising (OBR is a global call for ending sexual violence) in Delhi on 9 November, 2012 at Miranda House. We collaborated with the WDC Miranda House College to organize awareness campaigns as a part of OBR. On 21st and 22nd January, 2013 we held a joint programme at Miranda House College, where the students of Parivartan presented the safety audit of the campus. On 21 st January, Shabana Azmi addressed the gathering as part of global OBR campaign and on 22nd there was a panel discussion on sexual violence. Parivartan was constantly active during the promotional activities of the OBR till 14th. It was also a part of the final program at Miranda House College on 14th of February. A noted gender-theatre activist Maya Rao performed and a street play competition took place. Our team was also present at the program which took place at Parliament Street in the evening on 14 th .

<p>Throughout the month of January and February, 2013, a group of around 20 student members of Parivartan conducted surveys for the safety-audit and came out with incredible results. This safety audit results and analysis were eventually published in on the internet site kafila.org reported in the Times of India (8/3/2013) and The Hindu on (11/3/2013). A copy of the same with our recommendations was also sent to the DU Vice Chancellor on International Women’s Day. This safety audit was appreciated by various people, in and outside the university, who have also given very important suggestions to strengthen and better the audit. What is remarkable about this audit is that the students took the initiative and formulated the questionnaires on their own.</p>
<p>Various members of Parivartan also participated in rallies and protests against sexual violence and gender-rights that were happening in the city, for example, the <i>Bekhauf Azaadi</i> campaign in February</p>
<p>Nazariya, the annual fest of the society was held on 19th and 20th March, 2013. The theme of the fest was “Dissecting a Culture of Sexual Violence”. The controversy over the BBC documentary film 'India's Daughter' on that incident case became the focus of our last seminar discussion, entitled '**Rape, Film, City**' co-organised with Montage, The Film Society. The discussion, the invited speakers, enabled us to grapple with legal and social dimensions of the issue, revisit some of the questions around gender, law and media, and also examine the nature and source of our own response to incident and the film.

This academic year saw Parivartan beginning yet another endeavour – Parivartan Reads. Conceived of as a series of sessions---where the reading group (consisting of students from Parivartan) would read and discuss a set of texts around gender. The group read and discuss a variety (both fiction and non-fiction) related to gender, sexuality, desire, love, society etc.


1. The minutes of the meeting of the Governing Body held on 11.12.2014 were confirmed.

Since the proceedee has committed grave misconduct, which is unbecoming of a Principal of a College and levelled false allegations against the Lady Registrar of Delhi Univ, the Vice Chancellor of Delhi Univ, Chairman of Governing Body, by calling outsiders and press media in college premises in an unauthorised press conference, causing its publication in leading newspapers the next day, he is not fit to be retained in college. The Governing Body decides to terminate the services by imposing a punishment of Dismissal from service on the Proceedee Dr Bhim Sen Singh.

Accordingly, as decided above, as per Clause 9 of Ordinance of University Calender and subject to approval of the Vice Chancellor, the Governing Body



has resolved to terminate the services of Dr B S Singh w.e.f. the date of approval of the Vice Chancellor.

The entire period of suspension, from 1.8.2012 to till the date of approval of Vice Chancellor of the above decision, is decided as period not spent on duty for all intents and purposes.

The Chairperson was authorized to communicate the decision immediately to the Vice-Chancellor for his approval.

4. It was decided that the college should take appropriate action as per the norms.
5. It was decided that Dr. Bhim Sen Singh be asked to give his comments on the complaints. Further, Mr. Manoj Sharma be also asked regarding the complaint in which his name is also mentioned.
6. Mr Sanjeet Kr. Singh be informed that he is working against the post which does not exist in the college as per UGC norms.
7. Reported the acceptance of the resignation letter of Dr Firdos Anwar.
8. In any other matter Mr. Sharad Chaturvedi raised point regarding memorandum issued to Dr. Bhim Sen Singh on 06.11.2014 regarding OBC funds. In the last meeting of the Governing Body, the Chairman was authorised to appoint Inquiry Officer as well as Presenting Officer. The Chairman informed that the Inquiry Officer as well as Presenting Officer could not be appointed so far and steps would be taken to appoint them soon.

Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.

REPORT OF THE BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Building Committee, constituted by the Governing Body, held a few meetings before the start of the present academic session wherein the poor condition of Hostel building was discussed and members felt that the Hostel building needs to be given immediate attention. The committee decided to withhold admissions to the Hostel this year and initiated a process to appoint an architect to carry out the desired renovation work in the hostel. In response to the invitation that was duly advertised, the college received a few bids for the same. The committee examined the Technical bids of all the architects and found all of them to be eligible. In the next meeting of the Building Committee (that was held in the presence of Gym Committee members) the Financial bids of all the bidders were opened in the presence of all those bidders who had turned up for the same. After examining the financial bids, the comparative analysis was prepared and the lowest bidder M/s Studio Plus was identified. A sub-committee of some senior members of the committee consisting of Sh. Sanjay Verma, Dr. K A Singh, Sh. Ajay Ranjan Singh, Dr. Ramananda and Dr. R. K. Pandey was constituted in the meeting. This sub-committee was asked to visit those colleges where the same architect had carried out renovation/construction work and give a report before September 29, when the committee decided to call the architect to give a presentation on the work that he intends to carry out in the college.

A Monitoring Committee consisting of three members under the Convenorship of Dr. Md. Baber Ali was also constituted to oversee the maintenance of College Building. Dr. Agam Kumar Jha and Dr. Siddhartha Lahon are the other two members of the Monitoring Committee.

The sub-committee submitted a satisfactory report in favour of the work of the architect and the members interacted with the architect during his presentation on September 29. Based on the interaction with the architect the committee asked him to help the college in carrying out a comprehensive health assessment of the entire building of the college. The committee hopes that this report would help the college in having an estimate of the entire expenditure and would also help us in setting up the priorities for different kind and area of renovation to be carried out in the due process.
